



RISE against hunger

The Centreville Rotary Club partnered with Rise Against Hunger to play their part in the fight against world hunger. On Saturday, February 3, our Club hosted over 50 volunteers to pack 10,000 dehydrated meals. The meals consisted of rice, soy, dried vegetables, and a pack of nutrients. The ingredients were measured and poured precisely, weighed, then sealed in a plastic bag. The meals were then boxed up and sent out on a truck to their eventual destination of Haiti.

Rise Against Hunger (RAH) is an organization with a mission to end World Hunger. They provide the ingredients in bulk, measuring and packaging equipment, and transport. The Rotary Club just needed to provide the volunteers! This event is not free though. To host a meal packing event of this size requires a \$4,000 payment to RAH. The Club was able to afford to do this with

the assistance of a Rotary District Grant. This grant covered close to 80% of the total cost.


The day consisted of an hour and a half set-up, a 2-hour packing shift, and an hour of clean-up. A total of five assembly lines were created. Each line consisted of 5 meal packers, 2 weighers, 2 sealers, a runner, and a boxer.

This event was open to the public, meaning more than just Rotarians came out to volunteer. Many students came from Queen Anne's County High School and Gunston Day School, along with parents, and various residents of Centreville. The volunteers ranged in age from 16–80—there was a place for everyone on the assembly line!

The day was a huge success! Everyone who came out seemed to have a great time and knew that they were making a difference to a community struggling with food insecurity. Two of The Centreville Rotary Club's current Primary Areas of Activity are 'Addressing Food Insecurity' and 'Providing Financial Support for National and International Projects.' This project hit the nail on the head for both areas!








Addressing food insecurity is one of several priority activities set forth in Centreville Rotary's strategic plan. To help address this critical need, the Club holds various food drives and a Crab Raffle in the fall of each year to provide nutritious food supplies to those experiencing insecurity in our community.

With generous sponsorship support from **Draper Brothers**, **Cranky Crab**, **Buddy's Crabs**, **C. Legg's Seafood**, and **Minuteman Press** the raffle raised over \$4,000. The Club awarded grants to several local food bank programs operated by Haven Ministries, Centreville Methodist Church, Our Mother of Sorrows Catholic Church, and Wye River Upper School. The Club also made a grant to the Backpack for Kids program which provided food for over 2,000 local children.

In September, the lucky winning tickets were drawn. First place winner Jay Johns received two half bushels of crabs from Cranky Crab and C. Legg's Seafood along with two cases of beer from Drapers. The second prize winner Shore United Bank received one half bushel of crabs from Buddy's Crabs and a case of beer also from Drapers.



CENTREVILLE ROTARY HOUSE—A 'Safe Place'

Even today, many women and children live in abusive relationships and have difficulty removing themselves from harm. The Centreville Rotary House came about 20 years ago when club members decided the community would benefit from a 'safe house' that would be available for women and children who suffered from domestic violence.

The professional and talented members of the Centreville Rotary Club initiated a capital fund campaign, acquired land, designed and built a two story home (divided into two, three bedroom apartments) and partnered with the Mid-Shore Council on Family Violence (MSCFV) to identify and work with clients that would benefit from this safe haven. The Rotary House is maintained by the Centreville Rotary Community Fund, Inc. a 501c3 nonprofit that funds the maintenance and upkeep of the house. The Centreville Rotary Club dedicates the funds they raise from the Flags for Heroes project to support the Centreville Rotary Community Fund, and also identifies additional fund-raising activities to ensure the house is well maintained.

From the beginning, the club formed a partnership with the MSCFV, which vets the families who live in the house, provides mentoring to the families, and makes additional resources available as needed. To have a safe and stable place to make a home is critical to the recovery of victims of domestic violence. We are extremely proud that since its inception the Rotary House has been home to 18 families and more than 50 children. To hear the reallife success stories of our former Rotary House residents is beyond gratifying.

The house costs approximately \$10,000 a year in general operating expenses (utilities, security, internet access, lawn and tree care, and overall maintenance of the house). When one family leaves, the apartment is cleaned, repainted and repaired so a new family can move into a sparkling fresh home. The Rotary House has been in continuous use since 2008. 

LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OF THE YEAR AWARD 2023





The Centreville Rotary Club recently awarded the Sergeant Wallace J. Mowbray Memorial Award for Outstanding Law Enforcement Officer for Queen Anne's County to Trooper Christopher Severa, Maryland State Police, Centreville Barrack, in honor of his extraordinary service and performance as an officer as well as his commendable community service.

Additional nominees from other law enforcement agencies with jurisdiction in Queen Anne's County included Officer Shirelle Brooks, QAC Dept of Public Safety Corrections; Officer Mark Linton, MD Transportation Authority Policy; Deputy First Class Dominic Sullivan, QAC Sheriff's Office; and Officer First Class Devin Dieter, MD Natural Resources Police. Approximately 15 officers from the various agencies were in attendance for a breakfast held in May and each nominee received a certificate of appreciation for their outstanding service and dedication to the community.

As the 2023 award winner, Trooper Severa received an engraved plaque. A master plaque recognizing all past award recipients is displayed in the Circuit Court for Queen Anne's County in Centreville. The Sergeant Wallace J. Mowbray Memorial Award has been presented by the Centreville Rotary Club since 1975 when Sgt. Mowbray was killed while investigating a suspicious vehicle. The club makes the award close to May 15th, which is the National Law Enforcement Memorial Day.

2022–2023 Centreville Rotary President Judy Price thanked all the officers for their dedication and professionalism in protecting the safety of the citizens, and the natural resources of, the county. She further commented "The profession you chose is a noble calling and we are indebted to you and the many other dedicated men and women who represent law enforcement in our community."



CITIZEN OF THE YEAR AWARD 2023



The Centreville Rotary Club awarded its 2023 Citizen of the Year Award to QUEEN ANNE'S COUNTY SHERIFF GARY HOFMANN during its June 15 breakfast meeting at the Centreville United Methodist Church. The award has been presented annually by the club for several years and is intended to honor outstanding individuals who have had a major impact on the local community. Additional nominees included Dale Walls and Brian Tyler, both of Centreville, and Linda Austin of Stevensville. This year the club also presented a second award in the Youth category to JULIA KRIES, A 2023 GRADUATE OF QUEEN ANNE'S COUNTY HIGH SCHOOL.



Sheriff Hofmann received the award for his extraordinary efforts and compassion to support the citizens of Queen Anne's County above and beyond his service as the county's chief law enforcement officer. Examples noted during the ceremony of his exceptional community service were his active work with individuals and families affected by drug and alcohol addiction and those with developmental disabilities, as well as volunteering his time and expertise speaking to students, senior citizens and community groups on topics such as personal safety, scams, cyber bullying, substance abuse, and human trafficking.

Gary Hofmann has served as Sheriff for Queen Anne's County since 2006 and previously worked in law enforcement within the County for 13 years. He attended the University of Virginia and graduated from the FBI National Academy as well as the FBI Law Enforcement Executive Development School. He serves on numerous

task forces and state boards while also actively supporting multiple charitable organizations within the County.


Upon accepting the award, Sheriff Hofmann said, "I am extremely humbled and thankful to be selected as this year's recipient among so many other well-deserving nominees. It is truly a pleasure and honor to serve our community. The hours may be long and sometimes stressful, but working for the citizens of Queen Anne's County is a privilege. It clearly is a career that I'm very proud to have and will continue to do with the public's support and trust."

Julia Kries was selected for the Centreville Rotary Youth Citizen of the Year Award for her leadership and service primarily as president of the Queen Anne's County High School Interact Club modeled after Rotary's motto of Service Above Self. In that capacity she spearheaded several community projects including canned food drives, Project Christmas Child and the Linus Project making blankets for hospitalized children. In addition, Julia is a member of Girl Scouts USA and has earned the highest distinction as a recipient of its gold and silver awards. She also played clarinet in her high school band and received the distinction of being selected for the All-Shore Band, the honor band of Maryland's Eastern Shore. Julia will be attending University of Maryland and has expressed a desire to become a physician. She lives in Centreville and is the daughter of Jill and Darrell Kries.


BRINGING CLEAN WATER


to Northern Ghana

Centreville Rotary and Lifetime Wells International

As we all know, water is our most basic need. Yet millions around the globe are forced to rely on contaminated water to survive, risking illness and possible death each time they take a drink.

The Centreville Rotary has proudly supported Lifetime Wells International over the years with modest grants to help fund access to clean water in Africa. Recently, the club decided to make an even greater impact by supporting a project that would result in 22 new wells in the Tamale and Gushegu regions of Northern Ghana. Through the generous support of several individual club members and friends, as well as contributions from the Maryland Rotary Clubs of Kent Island and Chestertown, plus Rotarians from Bonita Springs, Florida and Camden-Wyoming, Delaware, we were able to leverage these funds to secure a grant of \$40,000 from Rotary District 7630 plus a \$32,000 Global Grant from Rotary International.





The overall project is expected to cost nearly \$100,000. Centreville Rotary is the international sponsor, partnering with the Rotary Club of Tamale in Northern Ghana as the local host club overseeing the project on the ground. Hydrogeologic survey work was completed in December 2023 locating 22+ sites that were likely to have a sufficient water source. Once the survey work was completed, Lifetime Wells International, which was co-founded by Centreville Rotarian Kenny Wood, began drilling in January 2024.

As this publication goes to press, nearly all 22 wells have been completed, bringing clean water and vastly improved sanitation to thousands of community residents whose access had been extremely limited or non-existent. Training to sustain project outcomes has been conducted within each local community which will own and maintain the wells.



QAC Employers generously participated in Career Day and enjoyed sharing information with students.


the second session students learned job interview skills. After a brief lesson on how to prepare and what to do and not do in an interview,
