




















Where We Were


- 1948 -1955 several epidemics, people avoided crowds, isolation, iron lung to support breathing
- 1952-1955 Dr. Salk and others develop vaccine, and approved
- 1961 Dr. Albert Sabin develops a second, licensed vaccine
- 1988 Global Polio Eradication Initiative founded
- 1994 Polio is considered eliminated in North and South America





Today

Share of one-year-olds who are vaccinated against polio, 2021 Share of one-year-olds who have received the third dose of polio-containing vaccine. This may be either the oral or the inactivated polio vaccine.



Note: Polio is a highly infectious viral disease. The polio virus invades the nervous system and can cause irreversible paralysis.

Our World in Data

> Wild poliovirus once paralyzed 7,000 children a week. In 2023, that number was only 12 children—over the entire *year*. That progress was possible because of brilliant innovators who discovered breakthroughs and frontline heroes who made sure that solutions reached children, even in the most remote parts of the world. And so much of *that* was possible because of philanthropy: Rotary International, our foundation, and other organizations dedicated to a future where polio is a thing of the past.
