Rotary's Vision Statement & Action Plan

Together, we see a world where **people** unite and take action to **create** lasting **change** — across the globe, in our communities, and in ourselves.

As People of Action, we understand that fulfilling that vision requires a plan:

Increase	Expand
our impact.	our reach.
Enhance participant engagement.	Increase our ability to adapt.





Increase our Impact:

- Increase membership in District 7670 by 100 net new members (starting number in RI from July 1, 2024)
- Install 50 Peace Poles throughout the District
- CART fund- \$40 per capita with 10 additional Roger Ackerman Circle Members
- At least fifty percent of clubs will achieve the Club Award of Excellence (formerly known as the Rotary Presidential Citation)





Expand our Reach:

- Charter four new Rotary Clubs of any type or model
- Donations to The Rotary Foundation reaches \$125 per capita
- Increase the number of Paul Harris Society Members by 20%
- One club in the district will become 100% Paul Harris Fellow Club
- Polio Plus giving of \$45 per capita
- Increase the number of Polio Plus Society Members by 20%





Enhance Participant Engagement:

- Each Club participates in Peace & Conflict Resolution conversations
- Establish a District RLI Committee and create a strategic plan for this committee
- Collaborate with other clubs and/or organizations to conduct a community cleanup or environment-focused project
- Increase the number of Rotary Direct users by 15%
- Club goals entered in Rotary Club Central by May 15, 2024 (a requirement to be eligible to receive a 24-25 district grant)
- Fifty attendees from District 7670 to attend the International Convention in Calgary, Canada (dates are June 21-25, 2025)





Increase our Ability to Adapt:


- All Clubs will conduct a Club Health Assessment in 24-25 or have plans to in the 25-26 Rotary year
- Establish a Rotaract Committee and charter or re-establish at least two Rotaract Clubs in the District
- Ensure that five more Clubs compare their Club demographics to their community and set a plan in motion to address gaps

Peace Pole Project

- A top priority of RI President Stephanie Urchick
- Visible sign that Rotary is a peacebuilding organization
- The Peace Pole itself (samples of the material, indoor/outdoor etc)
- District 7670 Goal: "plant" 50 Peace Poles in 2024-2025
- Emphasis goes beyond the planting of the poles: it is to intentionally engage in conversations about peace
- Peace should be a part of everything we do
- A Peace "toolkit" is being created
- Meg Lebeck (a Rotary Peace Scholar and member of the Rotary Club of Brevard) is District 7670 Peace Ambassador





Peace Pole Dedication Ceremony

- Public Image opportunity
- Can be a Big Deal depending on location and community
- Unveiling can be prior to or during event
- "The planting" can be part of the ceremony
- Can include a dedication plaque
- Hold participant's intentions for world peace

No more Pink Pages

- Cumbersome
- Duplicative to Presidential Citation (now known as Rotary Award of Excellence"
- Not easy to follow for many Club Presidents
- Didn't calculate automatically in many years
- Pink Pages had swings from year to year with DG priorities
- Many Club Presidents waited until the month that it was due and then scrambled to remember what happened 6 to 9 months ago
- DG Line decision supported by District Council to eliminate them





Process

- PEs set and enter goals into Rotary Club Central
- Two trainings being offered on how to enter your goals
- Goals align with the four pillars of the Rotary Action Plan
- PEs will be encouraged to enter progress toward their goals on a monthly basis






Presidential Trailblazer Map

- Club members sponsor new members
- DEI: Review and compare your Club demographics to your community

PRESIDENTIAL

RAILBLAZE

- DEI: Create a written plan to bring your Club's demographics to be in line with your community
- Conduct New Member Orientation and/or Fireside Chat for all new members to learn the history, vision, and good works of Rotary
- Host a Discover Rotary event for the first time; Host a Discover Rotary event if you've done one before
- Increase in net membership from the starting number on 6/30/2023 to year ending 6/30/24: Goals: 5% growth, 10% growth or 15 or more percent growth
- Reduce the number of "controllable" resignations from 2022-2025 to 2023-2024. Controllable resignations exclude those due to health reasons, death, relocations, etc. (increase retention through engagement).




PE Statistics






24-25 Club President Gender Breakdown








24-25 PE Gender Compare to District as of March 1, 2024







Current Member Age Ranges As of March 1, 2024


