# Global Grant Scholarship vs. Rotary Peace Fellowship?

#### **Global Grant Scholarship**

- •Funded: by Club and District
- •Qualifications: Bach degree and acceptance letter.
- •Application process <u>open year-round</u>. For scholars with a Fall start, date must complete/send grant application to District by 15 May and then TRF by 30 Jun.
- •Selection: virtually any international university.
  - **–University acceptance** is <u>before</u> Selection
- •Decision: Foundation decision takes about 3-4 weeks.
- •Reports: Annual & final grant progress report by club.

#### **Peace Fellowship**

- Funded: Entirely by RI
- •Qualification: Bach. degree and three years field experience.
- •Application process <u>season open only from</u> <u>Feb Jun</u> each year. Vetted applicants must reach District committee for interview by 1 Jun, endorsement to TRF by 1 July.
- •Selection: restricted to eight select universities offering Rotary fellow program.
  - -University acceptance is after Selection
- •Decision: TRF decision takes four months, announced in November for July academic start.
- •Reports: None, but expectation to share and maintain strong Rotary connection
- •Highly competitive!


# The Rotary Peace Centers program has a vision of sustainable peace:

Rotary partners with eight leading universities to host Rotary Peace Center programs that empower, educate, and increase the capacity of peacebuilders.

# **Rotary Peace Centers**



# Up to **130** Rotary Peace Fellows are chosen annually



#### **Master's program:**

- Those near the start of their careers
- 50 fellows per year (10 per center)
- 15-24 month course

#### **Certificate program:**

- Proven peace and development leaders
- 80 fellows per year (20 per cohort)
- One-year program



# Master's degree candidates must:

- Be proficient in English
- Have a bachelor's degree
- Have a strong and proven commitment to cross -cultural understanding and peace
- Demonstrate leadership skills
- Have at least three years of full-time experience in peace or development work

# Certificate program Fellowship components



#### Certificate candidates must:

- Be proficient in English
- Have a bachelor's degree
- Have a strong and proven commitment to cross-cultural understanding and peace
- Demonstrate leadership skills
- Have at least five years of full-time experience in peace or development work
- Be able to explain how their plan to promote peace aligns with Rotary's mission
- Candidates for Makerere University should also either be from the region or working in the area.



# Fellowship funding

#### **Total average funding:**

Master's fellowship: US\$75,000 Certificate fellowship: US\$11,000

#### **Master's funding includes:**

- Tuition
- Room and board
- Travel to and from country of study
- Internship expenses
- Conference/research expenses
- Insurance
- Contingency fund

#### **Certificate funding includes:**

- Tuition
- On-campus accommodations
- Travel to and from country of study
- Field study expenses
- Course materials
- Insurance

### **Timeline**

#### 2024 Rotary Peace Fellowship Important Dates and Deadlines for Districts

#### January - May

Complete all required trainings in the Rotary Learning Center

#### 1 February - 15 May

2024 Rotary Peace Fellowship application opens. Recruit and connect with candidates using promotional materials and other resources for Rotarians on our website.

#### **15 May**

**Completed applications due.** Staff will review all submitted applications and assign those that are eligible, qualified, and complete to Embark queues for endorsement consideration.

#### **June 1-30**

Review applications and interview candidates. Submit an endorsement decision for each candidate in Embark.

1 July District endorsements due. November Selections released. Candidates notified.

# How to apply

- Visit <u>rotary.org/peace-fellowships</u> to see the eligibility requirements and restrictions. Applications are available in **February**.
- Research the curriculum and programs at each Rotary Peace Center.
   Prepare to rank two centers for the master's program and choose one for the certificate program.
- <u>Connect with a local Rotary district</u> to request an interview and endorsement, which are required.
- Use the <u>Club Finder</u> to locate a club near you and engage with Rotary.
- Submit the online application to the district by **15 May**. You'll be notified of the Rotary Foundation's decision in **November**.
- Once selected, master's fellowship finalists must apply separately for university admission.
