Here are specific ideas to assist you in leading a successful Rotary year.

Membership

- Club members sponsor new members
- DEI: Review and compare your Club demographics to your community
- DEI: Create a written plan to bring your Club's demographics to be in line with your community
- Conduct New Member Orientation and/or Fireside Chat for all new members to learn the history, vision, and good works of Rotary
- Host a Discover Rotary event for the first time; Host a Discover Rotary event if you've done one before
- Increase in net membership from the starting number on 6/30/2023 to year ending 6/30/24: Goals: 5% growth, 10% growth or 15 or more percent growth
- Reduce the number of "controllable" resignations from 2022-2023 to 2023-2024. Controllable resignations exclude those due to health reasons, death, relocations, etc. (increase retention through engagement).

Public Image

- All items will include the proper use of correct Rotary Masterbrand logo
- Establish or maintain an active online presence (website or social media)
- Regularly publish a club bulletin/newsletter (digital, printed, or video)
- Create or update a club brochure or flyer
- Release news items to media regarding a local, district or international topic, event or project
- Produce & share a video about club event, fundraiser or project
- Submit entry to district public image competition

The Rotary Foundation

- Add a new (or new multiple) PHF w/ formal recognition at a club meeting
- Become or maintain all PHF club
- Add a new Paul Harris Society member
- Attain EREY status (\$25 per member contribution to the Annual Fund)
- Contribution of \$50 per capita to PolioPlus
- Host an "End Polio Now" event or activity within a week of October 24, 2023
- Members attend the District Foundation Banquet Fall of 2023; 1 point each, maximum 10
- Achieve 50% club enrollment in Rotary Direct
- Add a new Major Donor or Bequest Society Member
- Successfully execute a district grant or global grant
- Exceed \$125 per capital for Annual Contributions to The Rotary Foundation

Community Service

- Initiate a project in one of Rotary's 7 areas of focus
- Contribution of \$25 per capita to CART by May 1, 2024
- Log project & service hours in Rotary Club Central
- Collaborate on a project with another Rotary Club, a Rotaract Club or another community organization
- Invite DG or AG to participate in project, event or fundraiser

Administration

- President Nominee attends PETS (March 2024)
- President Elect or President Nominee attends another club meeting or project
- Enter Foundation, Polio & Membership goals in Rotary Club Central by 5/15/23. Note: For District Grant Eligibility they must be entered by 5/15/23
- Complete RI Compare in DACdb with updated photos, birthdays & emails in October and March 15
- Members registered for District Conference
- Present a club program or service project relevant to the monthly Rotary themes -(does not need to be done in the month listed)
 - July – Maternal and Child Health
 - August – Membership and New Club Development
 - September – Basic Education and Literacy
 - October – Economic and Community Development
 - November – Rotary Foundation
 - December – Disease Prevention and Treatment
 - January – Vocational Service
 - February – Peacebuilding and Conflict Prevention
 - March – Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene
 - April – Environment
 - May – Youth Service
 - June – Rotary Fellowships
- Select your President Nominee (President for 2025-26) by 12/31/2023
- Adopt Rotary International Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Statement in Club Constitution and conduct a relevant presentation or training for the club
- Enter names of Treasurer, Secretary, Foundation Chair, Membership Chair, Public Image Chair and Youth Protection Officer in DACdb by June 30, 2023
- Nominate a member to be considered for District Governor for 2026-27 by Sept 15, 2023. Candidate must complete interview.

Presidential Trailblazer

Here are specific ideas to assist you in leading a successful Rotary year.

Vocational Service

- Vocational talks by club members to Community venue (schools, Chamber of Commerce, etc.)
- Provide Community program on Rotary Four Way Test -Ethics
- Recognize a non-Rotarian community member for outstanding vocational service
- Establish or continue Four Way Test program in any school or home-education groups
- Present an example of Rotarians doing vocational service internationally or in the community to local Chamber or other venue

International Service

- Nominate or Sponsor a Peace Fellow or Global Scholar
- Participate in Global Grant – 30 points for sponsoring club
- Participate in Global Grant – 15 points for participating club
- Provide club program with an international service project speaker
- Members participate in an International Service Project (“boots on the ground”)
- Host or sponsor inbound or outbound Youth Exchange student

Youth Service

- Sponsor (or continue) an Interact Club
- Involve Rotary youth in club fundraiser or service project
- Provide club program with a Rotary youth participant
- RYLA – Student Applications submitted by December 31, 2023
- RYLA Club point of contact assigned and attends training in September, 2023.
- Club members take the online Rotary Youth Protection Program

Other Ideas

- Members attend RI Convention in Singapore, May 2024. 10 points each; max 50
- Host board retreat and review the Club Strategic Plan
- Members attend any session of Rotary Leadership Institute (RLI)
- 4) Sponsor/Charter a NEW club or satellite club
- 100% of Club Member’s photos are on DACdb Member Profile throughout the year
