Message from Holger Knack Rotary International President 2020-2021

Rotary International President-elect Holger Knaack is encouraging Rotarians to seize the many opportunities Rotary offers to enrich their lives and the communities they serve.

Knaack, a member of the Rotary Club of Herzogtum Lauenburg-Mölln, Germany, revealed the 2020-21 presidential theme, *Rotary Opens Opportunities*, to incoming district governors at the Rotary International Assembly in San Diego, California, USA, on 20 January.

Rotary isn't just a club for people to join, but rather "an invitation to endless opportunities," said Knaack, who becomes president on 1 July. He emphasized that Rotary creates pathways for members to improve their lives and the lives of those they help through service projects.

"We believe that our acts of service, big and small, create opportunities for people who need our help," Knaack said. He added that Rotary creates leadership opportunities and gives members the chance to travel the world to put their service ideas into action and make lifelong connections. "Everything we do opens another opportunity for someone, somewhere," said Knaack.

Changing for the future

Knaack also urged members to embrace change so Rotary can expand and thrive. Rather than setting a specific target for increasing the number of members, Knaack said he's asking clubs and districts to think about how to grow in a sustainable and organic way. He wants clubs to focus on keeping current members engaged and adding new members who are the right fit for their club.

"We need to stop thinking of new members as people we can mark down as statistics and then forget about," Knaack said. "Every new member changes us a little bit. That person brings a new perspective, new experiences. We need to embrace this constant renewal. We will grow stronger as we learn from new members."

Knaack pointed to Rotary's Action Plan as a compass that can guide clubs as they evolve. He recommended that every club have a strategic plan meeting at least once a year. At that meeting, clubs should ask where they want to be in five years and how they can bring more value to their members.

Knaack also wants to see more women in leadership roles and see Rotaractors play an integral role in how new clubs are formed and run. He encouraged district leaders to create new club models and rethink what it means to be in Rotary, and allow young people to be the architects of these new clubs.

"We have to be open to new approaches, and creating unique clubs for younger people is just part of the solution," said Knaack. "Let Rotaractors decide what kind of Rotary experience works best for them. These young people are bright, energetic, and they get things done."

In stressing the need for Rotary members to embrace change, Knaack noted that time won't slow down for Rotary: "We will not let rapid change defeat us. We will capture this moment to grow Rotary, making it stronger, more adaptable, and even more aligned with our core values."

Message from G. David Waechter District Governor 2020-2021

Dear Fellow Rotarian,

It is an honor and a privilege to serve as your District Governor for 2020-21. I am thankful for your commitment to service to your club, your district, and to *Doing Good in the World*.

Our beloved Rotary is changing. In fact, we face revolutionary change in the world today given technology, media, population, and society. We cannot ignore change and expect long-term success. We must embrace and manage change to ensure our clubs are flexible enough to withstand it. We must also remain true to the values and traditions that define who we are — and discard those which are archaic and unnecessary. We must envision what Rotary will be like for future generations. This will be a club level process supported by district leadership.

As we begin to consider the years ahead, I urge you to consider the value of Rotary. When people decide to join or leave Rotary, it is a value decision they are making. All of us should have priorities for our spiritual, family, work, leisure, and service time. First, I ask you to consider in what order these should be for yourself, and second, I suggest that almost everyone is doing the best they are able to do. The value of Rotary is defined by these. This year we will explore this and we will seek a clear description of the value of Rotary to our prospective members and the public.

The Rotary Strategic plan outlines four priorities for the next five years: increase our impact, expand our reach, enhance participant engagement, and increase our ability to adapt. As for how to begin implementing this plan, I submit to you three objectives for 2020-21.

We will start new clubs with innovative models and a heavy emphasis on community-based Rotaract. Rotaractors are not making the leap across the gap to legacy club membership. Community-based Rotaract is a sustainable model where young professionals can grow their families, their careers, and their engagement in Rotary. There is no wrong age to join Rotary and new club models address this. We want young professionals, middle aged families, and our seniors alike, to engage Rotary in creative and affordable ways.

We must make sure that prospective members understand what being a Rotarian means before they join. When we lose Rotarians because they stop enjoying Rotary, this is a very negative drain on our public image. I am urging clubs to implement a "membership pipeline". We can use an organized and systematic approach to recruitment and retention. This concept seeks to improve the quality of our membership recruitment process, not just the quantity of prospects. We want to grow Rotary, but we want to do so in a smart and well-considered way.

The Rotary Foundation transforms money into service that changes lives close to home and around the world. When you give to the Foundation, half of the money goes to international projects and half comes back to our district for district grants. I am asking Rotarians to give through Rotary Direct this year. It is easier for your Foundation Chair in your club, easier for the district, and ultimately, easier for you as a philanthropist. Please support the Annual Fund and also our efforts to End Polio Now. We are all weary in our battle to eradicate polio, but it is a promise we have made to Humanity. It is a promise we must keep, and it is a battle that we will win.

In conclusion, the success of this plan will be decided by you and your club, not a district act. I have been to numerous events in preparation for the role of District Governor and I have one reflection that continuously flashes in my mind – our district is a bright star in the constellation of Rotary. District 7670 is innovative, organized, thoughtful, professional, and most of all, generous. We are a great group of friends and **together**, **we open opportunities** for our members, our families, our businesses, and most importantly, for the people we serve.

May you and your club have a wonderful year of Rotary and the blessings of our Creator fall upon this world we live in and those whom we serve.






