Viktor provided the program for the meeting by sharing information about his experience with starting and running an ice carving business. As he explained, after years of being an executive chef and working 100-hour weeks, he felt the desire to try something different. Viktor noted that at that time, fruit and veggie carvings were very popular, so there were some very talented people to draw from. He got together with other chefs to create the business. One of their first big events was an ice carving for the 50-year celebration of the CEO of Panasonic. That carving took 40 blocks of ice to complete it. In the 90's a machine was created that took impurities out of the water, which improved the guality of the ice for carving. To avoid breaking the ice during the carving process, it was kept at 20 degrees. They hired a graphic artist to assist them. Creating the designs was done using special chisels, chain saws and they used molds for the smaller detail work. The business grew each year until 9/11 when contracts were canceled, and people were putting the money into charitable efforts. After that he went back to being a chef.
