At this meeting he spoke about the 41 places to visit, 35 parks, 3 staff natural areas, 4 state rivers, the lakes and informed us about the 600 miles of trails throughout the state. Tim made special mention of the Dismal Swamp Park and some of its history. For instance, the Dismal Swamp had been home to a moonshine operation. Additionally, shingles come from that area. Today, there is a 2,400-foot boardwalk. He then spoke about many of the parks and the some of the unique aspects about them (e.g., rock formations, minerals, and history). Along with the information he provided, there were many photos of these locations.
