#### Program

Before Bron introduced the speakers he noted that the number of fire fighters far exceed the number of police officers around the country. Statistically, there is a fire every 23 seconds. After sharing this information, he introduced Captain Drew Woodard who then introduced the other fire men who were there to share information about their work and how to handle specific types of fires and the appropriate fire suppressant for each. A large portion of the presentation focused on the different types of fire extinguishers and how to know which is appropriate for a given situation. The following are important items covered:

- Type A – Used for household fires (e.g., paper & cardboard).
- Type B – Used to extinguish combustible fluids.
- Type C – Used to extinguish electrical fires.
- Type D – Used to extinguish flammable metals.
- Type K – Used in restaurant kitchens.
