Program

Bob introduced Sheriff Shelby White, who has held the position for the past 7 years. He noted that his department has 24 full-time and 1 part-time deputies. Additionally, there are approximately 6-7 support staff (e.g., animal control, etc.). Currently, they are trying to get approval for 2 additional deputies to cover the town overnight. All vehicles have AED's & Narcan for medical emergencies. He then mentioned different investigative tools used to capture and identify the guilty. For instance, they use lie detector tests and video surveillance from stores, gas stations and even residential cameras (where the residents offer their video). Additionally, he is seeking to get cameras for the Town of Hertford (especially in higher crime areas). His office also works with ATF and is part of an internet crime network. He then noted statistics related to crime and their work with the courts. He concluded by talking about their volunteer activities within the community.
