


#### Who are our Members

- The way we ask the question matters
  - o Examples:
    - Someone who has speech difficulties may find it easier to give a thoughtful response in writing
    - Someone who is deaf/ hard of hearing may wish to respond using sign language
    - Someone with ADHD may find it easier to respond in a smaller group setting

Bottom Line: Just as each member's reason for joining is unique so too should be how we welcome them

- Members with physical disabilities may offer our Clubs the opportunity to redesign service projects to meet everyone's needs
- Members who are deaf or hard of hearing might allow us to create more interactive club meetings
- Members with neurological or developmental disabilities offer the chance to connect with others and learn about each other while focusing on what it means to be in Rotary.

### Strategies for Creating an Irresistible Club

- Flexible Accommodations:
  - Implement accommodations, such as meeting formats that cater to diverse communication styles.
- Inclusive Leadership:
  - Encourage neurodiverse individuals to take leadership roles.
- Support Networks:
  - Establish support groups to foster a sense of belonging for neurodiverse members.
