## 26.130 Rotary International Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) Statement (Rotary Code of Policies, January 2020)

As a global network that strives to build a world where people unite and take action to create lasting change, Rotary values diversity and celebrates the contributions of people of all backgrounds, regardless of their age, ethnicity, race, color, abilities, religion, socioeconomic status, culture, sex, sexual orientation, and gender identity.

Rotary will cultivate a diverse, equitable, and inclusive culture in which people from underrepresented groups have greater opportunities to participate as members and leaders. (April 2019 Mtg., Bd. Dec. 134)

- Create a community advisory board and invite diverse members from the community and from your Club to take part. You'll learn what's important to the community and discover ways to work together for action.
