VIRTUAL MEETINGS

- <u>Most clubs should start holding virtual meetings.</u> The District and many clubs use Zoom to do this, but there are many such services. Any club can afford a Zoom account. Meetings under 40 minutes with less than 100 participants are free: https://zoom.us/pricing (https://zoom.us/pricing)
- You can also get a discount on more expansive Zoom services with Rotary Global Rewards: http://rotary.perkhub.com/offers/9832-zoom-videoconferencing/click (http://rotary.perkhub.com/offers/9832zoom-video-conferencing/click)
- You can invite speakers to participate the same as if they were attending a regular meeting.
- Zoom allows PowerPoint and videos. Plus, a club member can even operate the PowerPoint slides for the speaker!
- Some clubs are inviting guests to their Zoom meetings. Be sure to follow up!

IDEAS FROM OUR OWN ZONE 33/34 ROTARY INTERNATIONAL DIRECTORS DAVID STOVALL AND STEPHANIE URCHICK



Presented on the March 23rd Zone Zoom call:

HERE ARE SOME BASIC IDEAS TO BEGIN YOUR OWN BRAINSTORMING OF WAYS "YOUR" #ROTARYCONNECTSTHEWORLD

Virtual meetings with Zoom, Kudo, Skype, GoToMeeting, etc. Try to 'meet' weekly.

• Invite yourself and your members to the Zone 33/34 Facebook group. It is there as a source for information which can be used by clubs and individuals. There are regular postings of current information and items to share, to help you engage members and stay connected.

• If virtual meetings aren't feasible, practical, consider going to the Rotary.org Learning Center and copy a video, paste it into an email to your members, and do that once a week.

Post a TED Talk each week from a member of your own club, maybe a club officer or director

•Record local leaders and speakers in your area and email it out once a week

•Go to the RI Zones 33/34 Facebook group and clip and copy or repost items to your own club's Facebook group.

 Invite members to address cards to "Resident" and send them to local senior care facilities with a personal note.

 If you have kids at home, perhaps think about having them color pictures and/or write messages to folks in nursing homes, and then mail these treasures to those who are isolated from their families due to the Coronavirus.

• Go to Rotary.org and sign up for some of the weekly emails sent out by staff. We make an effort to post them to the Facebook feed every week, but you can have them come directly to you and share with your members.

Rotary.org lists over 280 e-Clubs around the world. Visit some of them at their online meetings. You might bring new ideas back to your club

 Happy Bucks, CART FUND, and other cash donations can be done electronically via PayPal/Cash App/or even through the chat function of Zoom, members can text in their contributions and the club treasurer can add them to their club account.

• RI Directors David & Stephanie will be hosting this meeting on Friday mornings and Monday Noon each week. Invite your members to attend.

 Buddy system. Have club board designate a chain for folks to CALL each other weekly (or more often.) A way to keep members who don't use social media in the loop.

· Collect paperback books members have read, and place them in a 'little library' for others.

• Organize a "virtual tip jar" (get someone with IT expertise to do this...) Urge local wait staff at your meeting place or other to sign up and folks can 'donate' to their favorite servers...

• CONSIDER THE VIRTUAL TIP JAR FOR YOUR LOCAL FOOD BANK, and credit it toward our #10MillionMealChallenge. Make sure you report the meal equivalency on Rotary Club Central.



1. Getting Started with Zoom

You can download the app beforehand, <u>but it will also automatically install</u> <u>itself the first time you follow a zoom link to join a call</u>. Just try the link for your first call about five minutes early, to let that happen.

The meeting organizer will email you an invite that will look something like this:



Just click the link in the email (circled here in red) and Zoom will check whether the program is already on your computer, and if not, it will prompt you to download. It should be easy and pretty much run itself with a little encouragement from you in the way of OKs and "Yes" answers to prompts.

For instance, if it's a new install, when you click on the link your window should show this:

When prompted, select Run.

A download should start automatically in a few seconds. If not, download here.


And then along the bottom of the window, you should see something like this:

Do you want to run or save Zoom_o4288sofizku_d00b38ee9a3debe8.exe (75.3 K8) from us04launcher.zoom.us? Run Save * Cancel *

Choose "Run."

At this point, your computer will most likely ask whether it's OK to let Zoom make changes. Say yes.

Then you should see a window like this, with a progress bar:



When that finishes, you should be prompted to enter the name you want displayed to others in the call, then click "Join Meeting."

The meeting will open in a small window which you can enlarge to full screen to see everyone better.

2. Zoom Participant Tips

• Turn on as many lights as possible in the room, so you'll show up clearly.

 \cdot Don't sit in front of a lamp or a sunny window, or you'll be back-lit and hard to see.

 \cdot A lot of people find a plain wall to use as a background. That's up to you, but just be aware what people will see behind you in the shot.

• Unless you want to speak, it's a good idea to keep your microphone muted, especially if your dog is barking or you have other unpredictable noise sources around you.


• Unless asked by the moderator, it's considered polite to keep your camera on, since seeing others' faces is the reason for using Zoom instead of a conference call.
