Purpose: to recognize persons in the Cape Fear Region who have demonstrated Rotary's motto "Service Above Self." Our objective is to recognize individuals from the private sector, the public sector, and a non-profit organization.

This form is for anyone who wishes to make nominations for this annual award. Please provide the information requested and attach a description (around 300 to 500 words) of why the person nominated deserves the award. Our selection committee can only evaluate the candidate based on the information provided. It is important that your narrative provides relevant information but is clear and concise.

Criteria:

- The nominee has held a leadership position in their organization that has made a significant impact on the community's needs in one or more Rotary Areas of Focus:
 - Water and Sanitation
 - Peace and Conflict Prevention and Resolution.
 - Disease Prevention and Treatment
 - Maternal and Child Health
 - Basic Education and Literacy,
 - Economic and Community Development
 - Environment
- The nominee has led a life governed by the Rotary Four-Way Test:
 - o Is it the truth?
 - o Is it fair to all concerned?
 - o Will it build goodwill and better friendships?
 - o Will it be beneficial to all concerned?
- The nominee has demonstrated:
 - o A commitment to diversity, equity and inclusion
 - Leadership skills in personnel development
 - o Collaborative work with others in the community

Frequently asked questions:

Whom should I nominate? Nominate an exemplary leader in the private, public, or nonprofit sector who exemplifies the Rotary Four-Way Test. The nominee will have demonstrated success in one of Rotary's seven Areas of Focus.

- Why should I make a nomination? This is your opportunity to recognize an outstanding leader a colleague, a mentor, or someone you admire and share his or her success story with the Wilmington community.
- How will the winner be chosen? A committee of distinguished community leaders in and out of Rotary will screen the nominations and select the finalist in each award sector.
- What do you want to see in the nomination? Please provide factual descriptions of how the nominee had made a difference in any of the Rotary seven Areas of Focus. Keep the nomination clear and concise.
- Can I provide back-up documentation? Yes, but please no boilerplate resumes or press releases. You can include information about education, professional experience, and other awards.
