

The program on June 17 was presented by **Marilyn Easter** from Eastglen Farm. Eastglen Farm has over 300 registered Jerseys on 360 acres in Laurens County.



SC Dairy Facts: The SC dairy industry generated an estimated \$160 million in economic activity in 2011.

Total amount of milk produced in the state during 2011 amounted to 32 million gallons.

Each dairy cow in SC produced an average of 1,997 gallons of milk in 2011.

The average value of a day's milk was \$10.30 per cow during 2011 and a dairy cow cost about \$1,530 per head.

July 1st program was presented by **Suzie Bannister** from the *West Market School of Early Education*. The early childhood center serves three and four year old children in Anderson School District Five who have been determined to be "at risk". The South Carolina State Four Year Old Standards are taught through thematic units. Each class has a certified teacher and teaching assistant and their comprehensive program is designed to prepare children for academic and social success. For more information on the School, go to:
