The Rotary Four Way Test

Of all the things we think, say and do:

- 1 Is it the Truth?
- 2 Is it Fair to all concerned?
- 3 Will it build Goodwill and Better Friendships?
- 4 Will it be Beneficial to all concerned?

Guidelines

- Review the judging categories before starting the contest.
- Give the **first** speaker a "4" in each category.
- As you judge the following speakers, rank them in each category by comparing them to the first speaker. For example, in any category, if you think a following speaker is better than the first, give that speaker a score higher than "4."
- If you think a following speaker is less good than the first, give that speaker a score lower than "4." How much higher or lower depends on your own comparative judgment.
- Thus it is possible for the first speaker to win the contest, even with only mid-range scores, if you judge the following speakers to be less strong.
- Speeches must be at least five, but not longer than seven minutes. A timer should give each speaker visual signals at four and one-half minutes and every 30 seconds thereafter.
