### WHAT ELSE Have we been doing?

Our Club model tracks both service hours, donations in cash and in kind, and individual's work for humanity towards a TEAM total. To date we have collectively given over \$3,000 to the **Rotary Annual Fund**, \$1000 for **Polio**, to the **Ukraine Disaster Relief** and to the **Rotary** Environment Area of Focus. Additionally, our members are also involved in Special Olympics, Blood and Platelet Donation, Movember (cause for awareness of Men's diseases), **Diversity Education, Environmental Awareness** to include the **dangers of balloons in the** ocean and environment, recycling awareness and promotion, assistance to the elderly in technology, Leadership in Rotary with three District Positions (Youth Services Chair incoming, DGE to DG 22-23, and one AG). Support to Hats not Hate by collecting wool (anti bullying project), adopted an elephant from the Sheldrick Foundation in Kenya, Donated books to a school in Sacramento, Donated to a battered women's shelter in Christchurch, New Zealand, Adopted a family for clothing and gift card donation and working with two Clubs for the Day of Service in two Districts and a Graphics Design program offered to many Clubs from our member in British Columbia. Chef Kashia has also been helping youth learn skills for future jobs and careers. And in the UK, Caroline is an advocate for disabilities education and sepsis awareness across the country. Donations to the Red Cross in Lithuania from one of our members for Ukraine relief just took place. The volunteer hours are impressive—with an end of year goal of many thousands of hours.
