The organization dear to the hear of our Ex President, Jimmy Carter, is alive and well in Connecticut. Habitat for Humanities is in the process of building a home, right now, in New Milford. The families who receive the homes are carefully selected, both for need and for responsibility. They are expected to contribute a set number of man hours to the building process, and in the end receive a home that has an interest free mortgage. The homes



are completely build by volunteers, and forclusures are rare. Two of the original home owners have completely paid off their homes.



In addition to the home building component, the Heusatonic HH has a 10,000 square foot warehouse of used building materials available to the public to raise funds. A third component is A Brush of Kindness, providing repairs and painting for the homes.
