Our newly elected DG, Trish Pearson, charged the club to reach out to the minorities in the community and start building the club anew. We need to look more at age, gender race, and more varied professions, and enrich the club with diversity.



Trish told us about a 5 club group she has organized focused mainly on Networking for Business, which now has 25 active members.

Her major project for her Rotary year will focus on a school in Kenya, a program started by a dedicated lady in Bethany, The program is titled "Women in Crisis," which started as a preschool and has just graduated its latest 8th grade class. Students must apply to attend the higher grades in Kenya, and all of their students made the cut.

The upper grades now have computers, and the school has its own garden, and cows to feed the students. A well drilling operation is now underway and this formerly very poor, backward community is now on the march.

Trish's focus for the clubs this year is tri-fold:

- 1- We need to become more savvy in our use of the media. Familiarity with DaCdb is essential, and she encourages all club members to explore this website.
- 2- We need to extend our Stratigic Planning efforts. She is now initiating Visionary programs.
- 3-More leadership development is needed. We need to find better ways of identifying future club and District leaders and chairpersons. Strong leadership is essential to healthy club growth.

Finally, she encouraged the club to attend the Gala Club Conference next year that will be held in Burlington, VT. It will be in conjunction with District 7870 and will be on the shores of beautiful Lake Champlain.
