
From the Editor's Desk:

When I visited the Key Largo Rotary Club in July, I discovered that the incoming president was Jennifer McComb. It reminded me that over my 50 years in Rotary, the admission of women to our club actually happened during my years of membership. In June of 1977, the Rotary Club of Duarte, Calif. Inducted 2 women into their club. Rotary International quickly



responded, and revoked their charter *Jennifer McComb* on 3/27/78. The Duarte Club sued, and the suit ended up in the US Supreme Court, which unanimously decided that RI could not discriminate against women, and that was that—for then. Now 52% of all clubs in the world have women, 7.5% of District Governors are women (including our own, Trish Pearson) and the organization is richer for it. One of our members concluded that adding women to Rotary has changed its collective I.Q by 30 points.

When the issue was being debated before the Supreme



Court had made its decision, we had a straw poll, and 95% of the club members were against women in Rotary. After the decision, an elderly icon of the Club, Ted Baruch, brought in the first women, the CEO of a local Charitable Organization. When I asked Ted, "Why did you bring the first woman into our club; you were so strongly opposed to it?" He laconically replied, "Ralph,

she is more manlike than a woman." Who can argue with that. Ted was the man to break the ice.

Ted studied engineering in his youth, then finished up at Columbia Law School. He was an advisor to FDR, and designed a camp stove that literally saved thousands of lives during WW II by heating without producing large amounts of CO2. Later Ted became an executive at Pepsi and increased their sales substantially worldwide. He later found Heli-Coil a major company on the stock exchange, and was on numerous boards throughout the city. While serving as president of our Rotary Club, Ted founded the Danbury Rotary Trust for Charitable Purposes and funded

it with a substantial gift to the organization—but Ted was best known for his bawdy humor. Only an elderly, paunchy gentleman with unlimited credentials could get away with his jokes; some guests were in total shock at his off color punch lines. Still we miss Ted. He died in Ft Lauderdale, in 2005, at 97. Yours in Rotary Service, Ralph

pleasant thoughts, our heart rate goes down, and when we get angry, it shoots up. The club cracked a collective smile at his term Assitude which involved shaking or applying pressure to the gluteus maximus muscles, which he insists is a major reliever of stress. Having a positive mental attitude appears to be the key at controlling stress—which is a major cause of headaches.
