Mini-experiment: On July 9, 1945 (my birthday) I stepped out of the house and gazed at a myriad of crescent's projected on our garage. Apparently the trees had acted like a pinhole camera, during an eclipse of the sun. I have verified that such an event can occur. In an attempt to duplicate this unusual phenomena, on 8/21/17 I poked a number of holes in a piece of cardboard, and projected the sun into the bottom of a cardboard box. The outcome can be seen to the right. Apparently the clarity of the different images is related to the accuracy of the pinholes (which I hastily made with the point of a pair of scizzors—not the best tool). Tinfoil and a pin would have been better, but the outcome was better than expected. I'll do better with the next full eclipse on 4/8/24.
