Juan F. Tapia Tells the Club Why He Believes in the Dreamers:

Our speaker, a 2013 Danbury Rotary Scholar who joined the USAF after graduating from college, told us why we need to understand the plight of the many undocumented aliens in our state. As a member of C4D, CT Students for a

Dream, he has courageously been fighting to give the undocumented youth and their families visibility in our society, and wants them to be given some basic rights that they have been denied. One of the most recent victories of C4D is



getting the legislature to pass a bill that would allow them state level tuition in our local colleges and universities.

He told us of his own scary childhood living in Mexico, and insisted that every child who can profit from a higher education should be able to get it...and a college degree not only benefits the student who receives it, it ultimately benefits society as a whole. He explained, "Education was a passion to my mother. She was the inspiration that pushed me to where I am today." He encouraged the club to provide financial and moral support for a recent detainee, Eduardo Perez who fled to Connecticut to escape gang violence in Gutamala. Eduardo was a productive member of our community for 18 years until he was arrested and placed in detention a month ago. Juan insists he is not political; he is only acting on a humanitarian basis, and challenges us, "Isn't this what Rotary is all about?"
