12:15 pm, Wilton, Marly's Bistro David Stemerman, Candidate for Governor, and Joe Markley, Candidate for Lt Governor told the Club why they should be Elected:

Joe Markley spoke first. He admitted at he has never supported a tax increase, and never will. He has fought all restrictions on constitutional rights, and all unnecessary mandates that restrict business. He is against nearly all gun control initiatives, and unabashedly identifies himself as the most conservative member of the state Senate.



Markley will be running against two other candidates, Jayne Stevenson, First Selectman of Darien and Erin Stewart of New Britain. Stevenson's main issue is who would be best to take over the state in the event the Governor could no longer serve.



His other opponent, Mayor Erin Stewart is a longshot due to the struggles New Britain is having.

David Stemerman, an attorney with degrees from Yale and Harvard, and a wealthy hedge fund businessman, has his eve on repairing the economy. He has detailed plans on how he could stop the job drain, deal with the troubled pension problem, streamline the government and free up enough capital to invest in

our flagging infrastructure. In addition, he would do this while reducing taxes, and eliminating the death tax. Kevin Rennie, a former Republican state legislator told the Harford Courant that he had never met a candidate smarter than Stemerman. Like our own Mayor Boughton, he will be running against 4 other GOP candidates. May the best man/woman win, but he/she might not if you don't vote.
