Wayne grew up in an orphanage, dropped out of school, and was heading for a dead end life on the street, when the father of a friend admonished his son over the importance of an education telling his boy "Strive for excellence no matter what you do." A light went on, Wayne returned to school, spent 2 tours of duty on the SS



Enterprise, had a talk show for many years, was even a candidate for Congress in 2012, and he has never looked back.

Realizing the vast number of troubled but capable kids in the community, he dedicated the rest of his life to helping



as many as he could to also strive for excellence. He firmly believes that striving will overcome poverty and prejudice, He explained, "Being brave enough to fail means having the courage to risk failure in anything you are striving for, and use failure as a learning experience to move on."

Wayne with Pres. Fred This year BEF has given out 8 individual \$1,000 scholarships, and 40 \$1,000 scholarhips to the schools in the area.
