Tara A. Clancy Tells Us to Improve our Breathing, and Transform Our Lives:



Our speaker today describes herself as a Breathing Specialist. Her motivation to select her profession grew out of her own breathing problem, and a search to find solutions to it.

Ms. Clancy believes that most nighttime breathing problems have their roots in the way we breathe during the day. The culprit, she insists, is mouth breathing which results in cold, dry, unfiltered air (and the wrong amount) going in. She also outlined 6 ways our sleep can make

us more tired. Even more disturbing was her belief that breathing improperly will ultimately elongate the face, and has been related to Alzheimer's Disease.

Mark Havira Had the Winning Ticket, but Pulled a Losing Card:

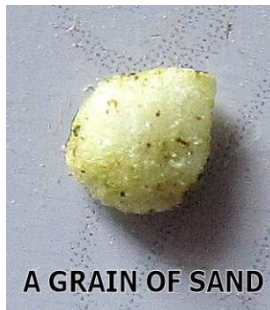
