Kathlene Gerrity, Executive Director of the Connecticut Burn Care Foundation, Informed the Club of Its Arthur C. Luf Children's Burn Camp, a Magical Place for Children who have Survived Burns:



Our speaker indicated that 95% of children who are burned, survive their burns—but the burn often create life changing disfigurement, and social rejection. The Children's Burn Camp provides a healing environment where the children are shielded from social disapproval and where they can experience many fun, social and

esteem building experiences. The children go swimming,

fishing, hiking, and they even have a zip line that is 35 feet in the air. It is staffed totally by volunteers many of who are certified in their fields of expertise (nursing, firefighting, etc.).



The types of burns include:

fire, chemical, contact with a hot *Cars can intensely burn* object and electrical, and 1,000 people are admitted to the hospital for burns, in CT, every year. Sadly, 16% of children who were burned were victims of child abuse. Upcoming fund raisers include: Softball (Danbury AOH)
