News about Polio Plus--We have good news and bad

news about our fight to eradicate Polio worldwide. Apparently there are 3 strains of the virus. Two and three have been eradicated, but one stubbornly hangs on, largely due to conflict at the Afghanistan and Pakistan border. Ninety four cases were reported this year, down from 50,000 a year when the program was started. Not bad,



but we will not rest until we have zero cases confirmed worldwide.

News about Membership Requirements—Rotary has totally relaxed its stringent membership rules. All clubs are encouraged to develop their own guidelines, and we are no longer just a "business and professional" organization. Attendance requirements are encouraged, but no longer mandatory. Rotary has gone inclusive instead of exclusive.

News about Vision: As we look to the future, we are encouraged to keep four priorities in mind:

- 1- We need to find more ways to increase our impact, measure it, and do more good in the world.
- 2- We need to expand our reach, by sharing our values, inspiring more personal action, and develop new models.
- 3- We need to enhance participant engagement, ensuring Rotarians to discover a long term value in membership, and find ways of developing better leadership.
- 4- We need to continually adapt, recognizing we live in a changing world, and develop new ideas that have lasting change.
