# Michael Mackniak, of Guardian Ad Litem Services, Informed us of the Important Services this Program Contributes to the Community:



Guardian is a program to protect the rights of people living with mental illness. It was formed in 2001 as a partnership between the Probate Court, the Dept. of Mental Health and Addiction Services, the Chief Forensic Psychiatrist's office, and Yale University. The ultimate goal is to improve services for people living with mental illness.

The project sponsors two programs: The Melissa's Project,

and the Conservative Care program. Melissa was a real person with mental illness who was nearly beaten to death behind the Danbury Library galvanizing her family to action. The Conservative Care program serves as a road map to families guiding them to the



services
available to
them in the
community.
Guardian has
become a



spokesperson for the mentally ill, and

will work with anyone who wants information, or clarification on issues relating to those with mental illness. Coordination of care is essential, and in the past has been wanting to say the least. Guardian works to coordinate the care of the mentally ill between doctors, hospitals, family, courts, resources, fiduciary matters, the law, the community at large, and available benefits.

Guardian is a shining example of another valuable resource our community has, yet few know about.
