When he was in his 20s and learning how to take calls from the dispatcher, a small boy ran into the firehouse and shouted, "Please help me. My mother is going to kill my baby brother." The dispatcher called the police while Barry ran across the street and found a distraught woman holding a baby with a butcher knife resting on his throat. Barry convinced her to hand the baby over to him, and met two policemen running up the steps with guns drawn. Two lives were probably saved that day, including the troubled mother's.

While serving as Danbury's Fire Marshall, a person shoved some burning material through the library book depository doing severe damage to the building and contents. Rotary provided funds for new books, and Barry was instrumental in changing the way books are deposited in libraries worldwide. He also forced a national mandate on fire doors, when he discovered a lumberyard could legally sell a sticker you could put on any door certifying it was a fire door. Much more to come.
