Speaker description: Ray Carissimi is a Milford Rotarian, 3D printing enthusiast, and local menace to society. He gave a really cool presentation today about 3D printers, how they work, and the politics behind them. 3D printers build objects layer-by-layer by extruding plastic through a superhot nozzle. Supports keep the prints from drooping and infill lets them stay rigid internally without having to make them completely solid. Did you know: The Cimbalom is a historically Central/Eastern European instrument. It looks like an open piano, except the strings are plucked, strummed, or hit with sticks. It is still very popular in gypsy or Slavic culture groups but has made a comeback recently in film soundtracks such as The Grand Budapest Hotel. It sounds like a clavichord or harpsichord. A good example of this instrument is during the Cimbalom solo of the Hungarian folk song "Cinege", during the last 1/3rd of the song.
