Speaker description: Danielle and Jessica both work for The Umbrella Center for Domestic Violence Services: A program of BHcare, which provides shelter and services for victims of domestic violence. They told us about the different types of domestic abuse that occur, such as financial abuse, physical abuse, or technological abuse (cyberstalking). 1 in 2 women will be a victim of a domestic abuse in their lifetimes, and 1 in 3 men will, but the numbers are much higher for transgender individuals or impoverished people. The Umbrella Center looks to greatly reduce those numbers through anonymous hotlines, free social care, and a diverse community network.
