



Time: 9:30 - 11:00 am



She can provide the material list, I can provide the presentation and a means for the club to raise the needed funds. Two weeks ago we had a successful disc golf tournament to raise the funds for our DMG for Simply Smiles.

My intention was to have my club lead this grant once we become eligible again but with the district funding available and the immediate need to rebuild I'm reaching out to all of you to help with finding a club that can help.
