Grant Johnson Red (Conservative) Co-Chair Grant is a native of Oregon where he has recently returned and

become active in the Republican party of Lane County. Luke is a mediator with Lane County Courts where he does small claims, and a restorative justice practitioner at The Center for Dialogue and Resolution. As a case manager in the Diversion program, he assists those charged with crimes to carry out a reparations agreement to address the impacts of their actions in lieu of standard court proceedings. Originally from New Hampshire, he has lived in Eugene since 2008, and is a nonviolence practitioner following after the example of Jesus, Gandhi, King, Marshall Rosenberg, and Miki Kashtan. He considers himself a liberal, far left, democratic socialist. He has been an activist supporting many causes including campaigning for Bernie Sanders, the environment, Black Lives Matter, standing up with indigenous people at Standing Rock, and generally transitioning from patriarchy and imperialism toward systems that serve the needs of all.

The first wave of a massive vaccination campaign against polio is wrapping up in Gaza. The GPEI is a public/private partnership led by national governments with six partners $\hat{a} \in \mathbb{C}$ the World Health Organization(WHO), **Rotary International**, the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the United Nations Children $\hat{a} \in \mathbb{C}$ Fund (UNICEF), Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation and Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance.
