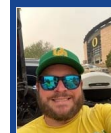

Activating your MyRotary account

- Go to my.rotary.org Click on the Register button in the upper right of page or the middle left of page - they both do the same thing
- On the new page that opens
 - Fill in the blanks for first and last name (use same name as appears on your Rotary emails)
 - Fill in your email address (same email address that appears on your Rotary emails)
 - Answer the Question "Are you 18 years or older" by clicking the Yes button
 - Click the button at the bottom of the page that says "I am not a robot"
 - Click Continue: An Activation email will be sent to you with a link for activating your account
- Click the link in the Activation email: A new page will open prompting you to activate your account
- Complete the Password and security questions (it is suggested you use the same password that you use to log into Dacdb for ease of use)
- Click Continue and you will be prompted to enter your newly created username (your email address) and your new password. Click Sign In. If everything goes as it should (particularly using the password that matches the one on record with Rotary) then you are in! No further steps are required.
- IF that doesn't work, the next page that opens will ask you to verify your Verify Member Status and you will have the opportunity to change to the correct email address.
- After successfully logging in, browse the website for a while if you wish or see below to check out your donor info.
- When you eventually log out, don't forget to tell your browser to remember your username and password (or do whatever else you normally do to remember your passwords)

How to track your Rotary giving in MyRotary

- Log in to your MyRotary account by going to My.Rotary.org, clicking the Sign In button at top right of page and entering the username (email address) and password you just set up
- On the page that opens, click the My Account button at the top right. From the drop-down box click My Donations
- On the new screen that opens, click Donor History Report under the My Reports and Forms heading
- Have a little patience while the electrons search the Internets to find and load your data.
- On the new page that opens, find and click the "Donor History Report" link (in blue font) and click it.
- Again, you may have to wait a bit while the data loads into report form but pretty soon you will see a page with a summary of your giving history!
- Don't hesitate to check out the rest of the pages in My Rotary - there is boatloads of interesting information, learning resources and guides.

The Rotary Foundation: Foundation Month



The Rotary Foundation (TRF) helps Rotary members to advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace by improving health, providing quality education, improving the environment, and alleviating poverty.

The Rotary Foundation began more than 100 years ago: At the 1917 convention, outgoing Rotary President Arch Klumph proposed setting up an endowment "for the purpose of doing good in the world." That one idea, and an initial contribution of \$26.50, set in motion a powerful force that has transformed millions of lives around the globe. Since then, TRF has invested more than **\$4 billion** in life-changing, sustainable projects and has a current endowment value of **\$2.3 billion**.

November is Rotary's TRF Month. Please remember: ***With your help, we can make lives better in our community and around the world.***

- For as little as 60 cents, a child can be protected from polio.
- \$50 can provide clean water to help fight waterborne illness.

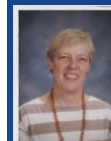

for Proposals

Your Eugene Rotary Charitable Fund (ERCF) window for accepting proposals for the next ERCF funding cycle is closing rapidly!

Next ERCF funding cycle

The ERCF is accepting grant proposals for the next funding cycle now, Proposals will be accepted through **November 30**. Proposal review takes place the week of December 1 with award announcements immediately following. Any member in good standing of the Rotary Club of Eugene may submit a proposal. Grant amounts vary but typically fall between \$5,000 to \$20,000, with special consideration given to projects benefitting youth. In order to be eligible for ERCF grants and disbursements, projects must satisfy the following criteria: 1. Support the advancement of educational, charitable and scientific purposes that fill human needs; 2. Have clear goals, including plans for measuring outcomes and ensuring sustainability; 3. Align with one or more of Rotary International's focus areas; 4. Include the Rotary Club of Eugene in project recognition. Members intending to submit are encouraged to contact an ERCF board member for additional proposal guidelines and advice if you have questions. Proposals **must** be vetted and adopted by one of the Club's standing committees (e.g, Community Service Committee, Environmental Committee, International Service Committee, etc.) before submittal to the ERCF board. Your ERCF board members are: Greg Stewart, Monica Wilton, Dave Frosaker, Jennifer Geller, Pete Gribskov and Jerry Harris.

Election of new Members: There are two ERCF board openings. Interested members in good standing should express their interest to one of the current board members (listed above). Prospective candidate names will be submitted to current club president Nathan Phillips in November for inclusion on the ballot for our Club elections held in early December.

Food for Lane County Falls Short with Food Drive!

Please support our long-time partner Food For Lane County

This fall's FFLC Food Drive kicked off with in-person donations on last Saturday, November 2nd at the FFLC facility, the Market of Choice at 29th & Willamette and the Delta Oaks Market of Choice. On the 2nd, the drive netted approximately 25% (~12,000 pounds of food) of what has been historically collected in the letter-carrier supported drives of the recent past (last year's drive netted over 43,000 pounds of food on the one-day of collecting supported by letter carriers in Eugene and Springfield. As noted last week, Eugene letter carriers declined to participate this year.) If you couldn't make a donation on November 2, it is not too late! You'll find **FFLC food barrels at all four Market of Choice locations from Nov. 2 through Nov. 24th**—look for them near the checkouts!

FFLC volunteer coordinator Dan Budd also reminded us that monetary donations give FFLC the flexibility to purchase needed food groups at a high volume discount, resulting in FFLC being able to feed twice as many folks as they are able to with straight food donations. News you can use (and other snippets of useless information)

November 18 is National Princess Day. "Anyone can be a princess! This special day encourages us to embrace our inner royalty and cherish the qualities that make us no less than princesses. Whether through strength, kindness, grace, or confidence, the day gives us an opportunity to channel our favorite princesses and live in our own fairy tale moments. National Princess Day reminds us of the inspiring traits that princesses represent, like courage, intelligence, and kindness."

(Ed. Note: not to be outdone:) **November 19** is International Men's Day. "International Men's Day has the potential to become the global medium to heal our world. The concept and themes of International Men's Day are designed to give hope to the depressed, faith to the lonely, comfort to the broken-hearted, transcend barriers, eliminate stereotypes and create a more caring humanity."

November 28 is Thanksgiving Day, the annual national holiday in the [United States](#) and [Canada](#) celebrating the harvest and other blessings of the past year. Americans generally believe that their Thanksgiving is modeled on a 1621 [harvest feast](#) shared by the English colonists ([Pilgrims](#)) of [Plymouth](#) and the [Wampanoag people](#). No record of the actual menu of 1621 exists but this American [holiday](#) is particularly rich in [legend](#) and symbolism, including an assumed traditional fare of the Thanksgiving meal that includes [turkey](#), bread stuffing, [potatoes](#), [cranberries](#), and [pumpkin](#) pie. In reality, the original feast probably served more ducks and geese than turkeys and the Wampanoag likely contributed [venison](#). Other foodstuffs probably included [fish](#), [eels](#), [shellfish](#), stews, [vegetables](#), and [beer](#).

November 29 is Native American Heritage Day and November is Native American Heritage Month. These were established to honor the first peoples of the Americas. To learn more, go to [Native American Heritage](#)

December 1 - Rosa Parks Day. The birth of the modern American civil rights movement occurred as Rosa Parks was arrested on this day in 1955 in Montgomery, Alabama, for refusing to give up her seat to a white man and move to the back section of a municipal bus. Her arrest resulted in a year-long boycott of the city bus system by African Americans and led to legal actions ending racial segregation on municipal buses throughout the South.

December 1 is the first day of Advent. Get your calendar up! I like the chocolate ones. What is your favorite?

December 3 is Giving Tuesday. Giving Tuesday, often described as a day of giving as part of a global generosity movement, is **held each year on the Tuesday after the date of Thanksgiving in the United States**. On Giving Tuesday 2021, nonprofits in the U.S. alone raised \$2.7 billion.
