# June 18th Meeting: Oregon Legislative Update



As the Speaker of the House of Representatives in the Oregon State Legislative Assembly, Julie Fahey is able to provide up-tothe-minute details of the recent and upcoming work in the House. Ms. Fahey will share her insights into the Oregon legislative process and what new legislation we can expect to see coming out of next year's long session.

#### Julie Fahey

Julie Fahey represents House District 14 (West Eugene & Veneta) in the Oregon State Legislature. She was first elected to the House in 2016 and was elected by her colleagues to serve as Speaker of the House in 2024. Prior to being elected Speaker, she served as House Majority Leader for two years.

In her time in the legislature, Speaker Fahey has focused on housing affordability and the homelessness crisis in Oregon.

Representative Fahey also championed an expansion of Oregon's automatic voter registration program and helped pass 2024's historic campaign finance reform bill that placed limits on campaign contributions. Other major pieces of legislation she has worked on include the 2017 Reproductive Health Equity Act and the 2019 Student Success Act.

Speaker Fahey has two decades of experience in the private sector as a business consultant and cofounder of a human resources consulting firm for businesses and nonprofits.




