June 25th Meeting: Oregon Bach Festival, James Boyd



Dr. James Boyd serves as the Oregon Bach Festival's Director of Programming and Administration ' working alongside OBF staff to advise, plan, and execute artistic programming, while also spearheading some of the Festival's administrative activities. A native Oregonian and UO School of Music and Dance alumnus (BA '98), Dr. Boyd has enjoyed a varied career as an administrator, performer, and educator. He comes to the OBF from the Louisiana Philharmonic Orchestra, where he initially served as Director of Artistic Planning and Production, became the Interim Managing Director, and eventually spent six years as the Chief Executive Officer.

Dr. Boyd is a graduate of the League of American Orchestra's Management Fellowship Program and holds a DMA and MM in Performance (clarinet) from the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music.



A native Oregonian and University of Oregon graduate, Dr. Boyd returned to the University of Oregon campus during the most difficult period the world of live performance has ever witnessed: the pandemic. His task was a monumental one; he was to produce Oregon Bach Festivalåe™s (OBF) first festival back since COVID-19.

"Trying to relaunch a festival after a two-year hiatus was a real challenge,†Boyd said. "The majority of our staff at the time had not produced a festival. They were talented, but that brain trust was not present, and there was a fear we would miss something somewhere. Somehow that did not happen, and we were fine in the end!â€

While OBF has a storied 53-year history to be honored and respected, Dr. Boyd saw the pandemic as an opportunity for a reset. It allowed him, along with staff, to program differently and to think about the role of music in the community in a new way. That shift was first reflected in the 2023 season, as Dr. Boyd expanded beyond the traditional OBF offerings. Today, the core focus of the festival is to present choral-orchestral repertoire inspired by Johann Sebastian Bach.

"Oregon Bach Festival is Bach at its core, and I do not see that ever changing,†he noted. "What has changed is the way we articulate that. If we say that we are focused on the choral-orchestral repertoire, that invites us to do a lot more programming with a lot more freedom. It is subtle, but as a programmer, it makes a huge difference.â€

Dr. Boyd will provide an update on everything OBF. If we are lucky, we may get to hear some music too!

Pillows and blankets


Bath towels
