Program- our Zoom speaker was Steven Campbell whose subject was "Making your Mind Magnificent." His eloquent talk emphasized how people of "all ages use their minds to realize their potential, foster positive change, and enhance their lives." 1. Your body believes everything you tell it.
2. Our feelings primarily come from our beliefs.
3. Our beliefs continually rewire themselves. Steven emphasized that we should "wallow" in our successes rather than pass them over.
