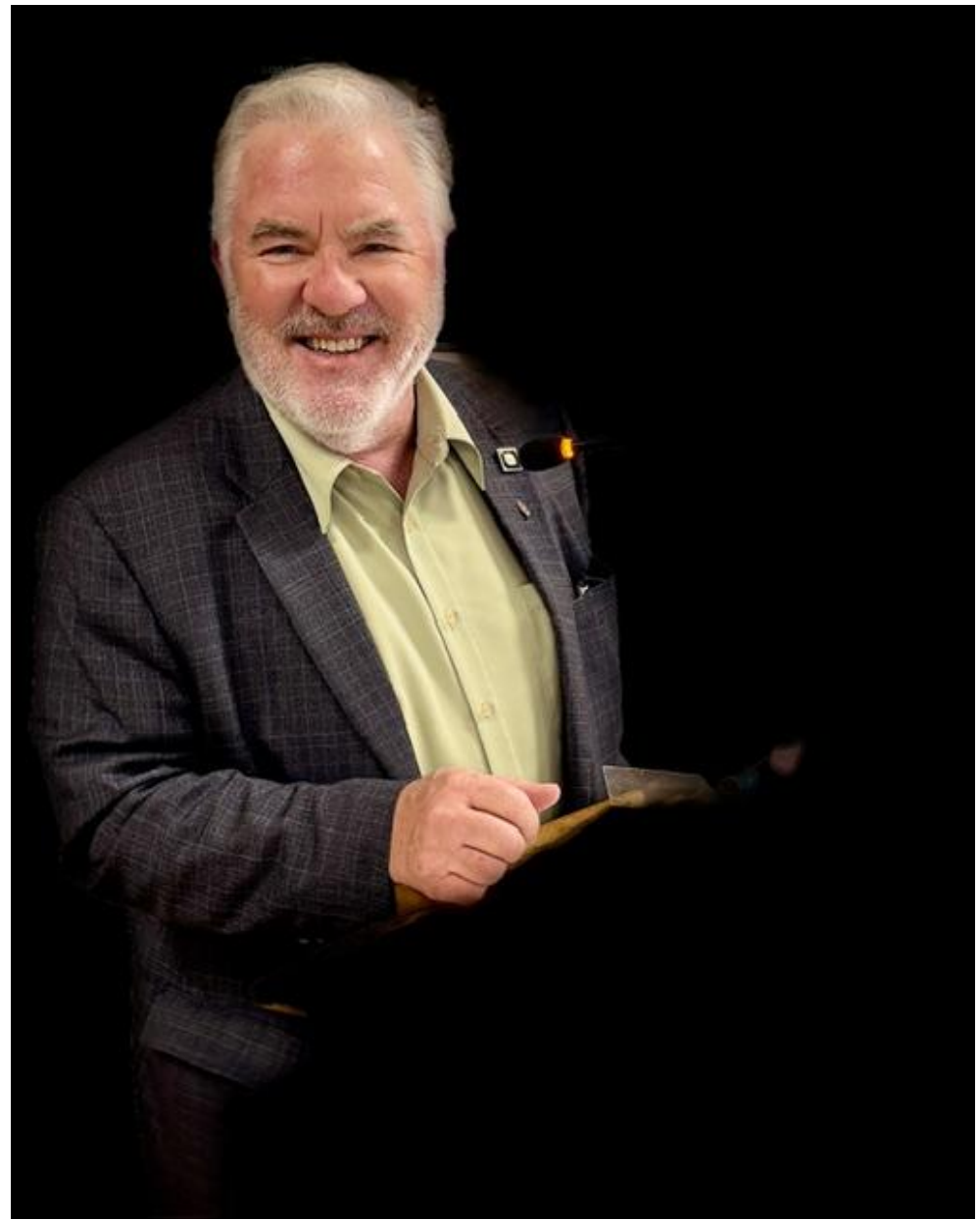

Safe Harbor Homes

Safe Harbor Homes and Services in Kingsburg is a Christian, long-term residential home for adults with developmental or special needs, located on a large, accessible property just south of Fresno. It offers 24/7 care, activities, and a family-style environment for residents, with a strong emphasis on faith and lifetime placement.

The Kingsburg home is on approximately 4.8 acres with an 8,000+ square foot house built in 2003, designed with wheelchair accessibility and spacious common areas.

The property includes a pool and spa, lawn and open space, plus a small farm area with animals, chicken coops, and a greenhouse used as part of resident activities.

Safe Harbor focuses on adults with special needs whose families are seeking a stable, long-term home where their adult children can live for life.

The home combines daily care, life-enrichment activities, and spiritual support, integrating residents into a small, family-like community.

Safe Harbor is explicitly Christ-centered, with leadership emphasizing spiritual care, prayer, and a Christian atmosphere in daily life.

Staff and board members describe the work as a ministry, aiming to show God's love through caregiving and community. The organization lists a Kingsburg mailing address at PO Box 446, Kingsburg, CA 93631, and a primary phone number of (925) 395-1998 for general inquiries.

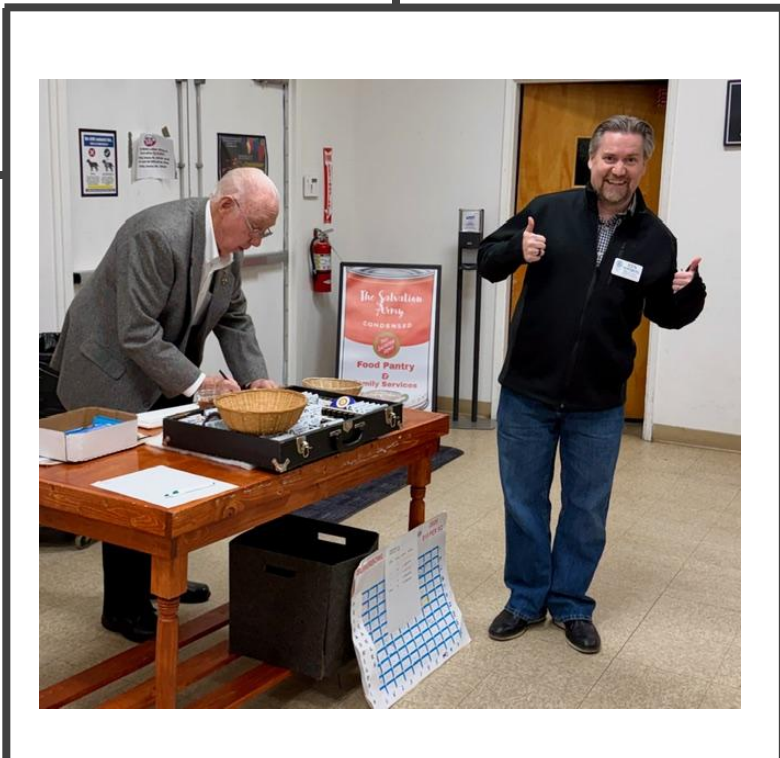
There is also a facility listing with a physical address on Road 16 in Kingsburg and a local phone line for the adult residential home, which families can use to ask about services, placement, or tours.

Bill and Lynette Mathews are the founders of Safe Harbor Homes & Services in Kingsburg, CA. They established the organization to provide homes for adults with special needs, with the first resident being their son, Kevin Mathews, who is deaf and can't speak. The organization is governed by the California Secretary of State and is a non-profit corporation approved by US Missions of the Assemblies of God.

Welcome!

Here's what delete actually means, and how to make sure your private stuff stays private.

📱 **The 30-day lie**

When you delete a photo, it doesn't disappear. It moves to a holding area and sits there for 30 days. Check yours right now:

- **iPhone:** Open **Photos** > **Collections** > scroll down to **Recently Deleted**. There's everything you thought you erased last month.
- **Android:** Open **Photos** or **Gallery** > tap **Library** or **Menu** > **Trash** or **Bin**. Same deal.

💾 **Ghost data**

Even after you empty Recently Deleted, the photo isn't gone. Your phone marks that storage space as available and hides the image from view. The actual data sits there, fully intact, until new photos or apps eventually overwrite it. That could take days, weeks or months.

• **News you can use!**



The fix: After deleting photos, empty the trash immediately.

- **iPhone: Recently Deleted** > **Select** > tap the three dot icon > **Delete All**.
- **Android: Trash** > tap the three dots > **Empty trash** > **Delete permanently**.

News you can use cont.

Cloud backup trap

Deleting an image from your phone doesn't delete it from iCloud or Google Photos. They're separate. You have to delete it twice.

- **iPhone:** Delete the photo, empty **Recently Deleted**, then open iCloud.com, go to **Photos > Collections > Recently Deleted**, and delete it again.

Before you sell your phone

A factory reset doesn't guarantee deletion. Studies show up to 40% of wiped phones still contain recoverable data. Here's what you need to do.

- **iPhone:** Settings > General > Transfer or Reset iPhone > Erase All Content and Settings. Let it finish. Then set it up as new and erase it AGAIN. Yes, twice.
- **Android:** Factory reset, fill the storage with junk files like big videos, then factory reset again. This overwrites the ghost data.

- **Android:** Delete from your gallery, then open Google Photos, go to **Collections > Trash**, and empty it.

Skip this step, and your deleted photo lives forever in the cloud.

🔍 Original recipe (1X) yields 4 servings

- 4 ounces cream cheese, softened
- 2/3 cup shredded sharp Cheddar cheese
- 1 1/2 tablespoons heavy cream
- 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt, divided
- 1/2 cup mayonnaise
- 2 cloves garlic, finely minced
- 8 slices hearty white bread
- 8 slices sharp Cheddar cheese
- 8 slices provolone cheese

Directions

Step 1

Stir cream cheese, shredded cheese, heavy cream, and 1/4 teaspoon salt together in a small bowl until well combined; set aside.

Step 2

Stir mayonnaise, garlic, and remaining salt together in a separate bowl; set aside.

Step 3

Place 2 slices Cheddar cheese on each of 4 pieces of bread. Spread cream cheese mixture evenly among the 4 Cheddar-topped slices; top each with 2 slices provolone cheese. Add remaining bread slices on top.

Step 4

Spread half of mayonnaise mixture evenly over tops of sandwiches.

Step 5

Heat a large nonstick skillet over medium heat. Place sandwiches in skillet, mayonnaise side down. Spread the top of each sandwich with remaining mayonnaise mixture.

Step 6

Cook sandwiches until golden brown on both sides, flipping occasionally until cheese is melted and bread is well toasted.

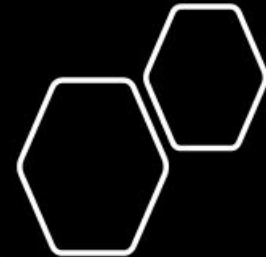
