

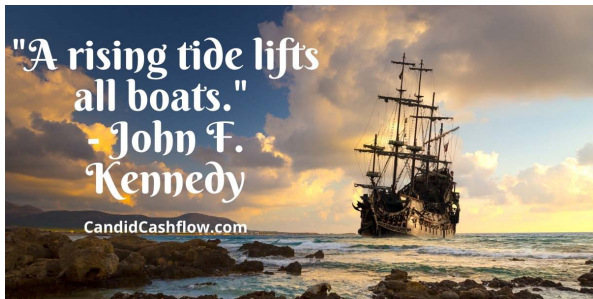

FBI Special Agent in Charge Aaron Rouse

PP Bob Hulshouser proudly introduced SAC Aaron Rouse of the FBI. He was an Army vet who became a New York state policeman and eventually moved to the FBI. He was recently presented with a Paul Harris Fellow by our club and was recognized at the FBI annual national conference for that honor.

Special Agent in Charge Rouse strongly encouraged the Student of the Month to consider a career in The FBI. There's something for everyone with 242 job classifications.

He shared that the success of the FBI hinges upon outreach to the community. He spent 25 years with the FBI and is now retiring after a total of 33 years in law enforcement. The agency's object is to protect American people and the constitution. The FBI is a force for good. They depend upon community partnerships and are present in 74 countries.

He's jealous of the next generation of US law enforcement reps. If he could do it again, he would. "It's a life of purpose with serious impact. It's fantastic work." The FBI recovers 82% of cyber crimes losses. FBI works with Nevada to lead the way in human trafficking recovery.

He and his wife are moving back to the DC area where he will be a consultant. President Lora presented SAC Rouse with a certificate for a flag in the Field of Honor and a deck of cards.
