Nevada Promise Scholarship Mentors

Bob Scheri introduced the speakers from CSN who spoke about mentoring in the Nevada promise scholarship. Legislative bill 2015 was passed to aid Las Vegas valley residence students to attend community college and then transfer to a four-year college UNLV or UNR. Three years are covered by the scholarship.

The scholarship is open to seniors in the summer prior to the senior year. They must apply and submit a FAFSA. Upon acceptance, they are then paired with a mentor.

Adrian was a mentee to Hillary, and they made a connection on so many levels. They are a great example of a successful mentorship. Adrian is graduating with a 4.0 GPA and has received numerous awards locally and nationally.

Mentors are an important part of the Nevada Promise Scholarship. A strong support structure is key to help students find success.

According to a [2011 study by the Institute of Higher Education Policy](#), mentoring for college students is a valuable strategy to provide students with the emotional and instrumental support they need to achieve the goal of a college degree. Mentoring also helps students feel more connected and engaged on campus, ultimately improving the chances for success.

CSN is seeking mentors of all backgrounds who are willing to give **3-5 hours each semester** to guide the future of Nevada: our youth. Mentors must be 21 years of age, willing to provide information to conduct a criminal history report, and able to participate in one mandatory online training session.
