**Feed the Polio Pig!**



**President Patrick** introduced new member **Barbara Billitzer**. Barbara attended Cal State Long Beach and upon graduation, went to work for United California Bank. She found banking pretty dry, so started on a new path by moving to the marketing department. She helped promote ATM use when they were first introduced and when UCB started interstate banking, she helped First Interstate Bank go national.

Next stop, Barbara went to work for BBDO Los Angeles advertising agency, working with Union Bank. She was scooped up by the Weiden-Kennedy agency who opened an office in Los Angeles marketing Honda Scooters. That was a fun gig since Honda sponsored many concerts and events.

Barbara then segued into the floral industry with Teleflora as a liaison to the florists. She was named Editor-in-Chief of their magazine, achieving two goals: it became a mouthpiece for the company and she made it profitable. After a 10-year stint with Teleflora, Barbara went to work for CB Commercial Real Estate. When they merged with Richard Ellis and became a global company, she helped retrofit 20,000 outlets.

In the early 2000's, she spent 6 months at a startup dealing with trans state real estate sales. After that, at Learning Tree, Barbara traveled around the world, but it was not compatible with having small kids.

In 2005, she became editor-in-chief at Right of Way Magazine. She met Val while there in 2010. They moved to the Las Vegas area in 2016.

New Member, **Val Hatley** shared his Craft Talk. As opposed to Barbara's varied career, Val was a "one trick pony". He was in the pipeline right of way profession. Upon graduating from law school, Val went to work for Shell Oil in Houston. He was with them for 32 years, His father was with Shell Oil for 43 years.

Val was born in New Orleans. He has been a Rotarian for 13 years and was President of the San Pedro, CA club. He served with the Salvation Army in Southern California.

Val distributed maps of all the pipelines in the US. He told the group that there are three pipelines coming into the Las Vegas area. Prices are tied to the use of these pipelines. If damaged, alternative methods to transport fuel are by train or truck. It would be expensive and would impact the highways.

Val shared interesting stories about negotiations with landowners to obtain right of ways with title issues, sign-offs and eminent domain. He explained the difference between common and private corridor situations. He then answered a multitude of questions.
