**Dave McGovern** has been on the road again! He was in Texas to see his son, Matt

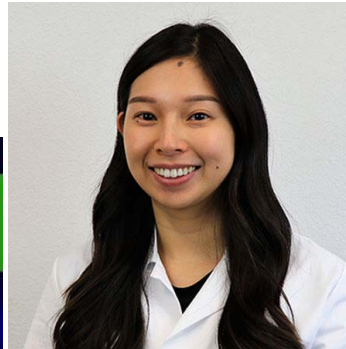
who had open-heart surgery. He was in Washington state for Eileen's grandson's bar mitzvah and in Houston for Eileen's check up.

Her primary clinical roles include caring for patients in the UNLV Health Pediatric Clinic and for newborns at the Sunrise Hospital Nursery. She is active in medical education and enjoys teaching medical students and resident physicians during their clinical rotations.

Dr. Sun received her bachelor's degree in biology and chemistry at the University of Utah before earning her MD degree at the University of Utah School of Medicine. Fluent in Mandarin-Chinese, Dr. Sun, who spent half her childhood in Taiwan, is eager to reach the Chinese community of Las Vegas and care for their children's medical needs.

Dr. Sun shared information on the polio vaccine and the poliovirus. She explained what poliomyelitis is, how it is transmitted and how the vaccine works. She shared who should be vaccinated and what percentage of the population is vaccinated. And, she explained how the outbreak happened in July 2022 in New York.

## Rotary International News:

Rotary and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation extending fundraising partnership to eradicate polio. *Partnership will infuse an additional US\$450 million into global polio eradication effort.*

Rotary and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation are renewing their longstanding partnership to end polio, announcing a joint commitment of up to \$450 million to support the global polio eradication effort.

"We've made tremendous progress, but the world is facing multiple pandemics, and vaccine hesitancy is on the rise. Recent polio outbreaks in Malawi and Mozambique, plus detection of poliovirus in Israel, the UK, and the United States prove that if polio exists anywhere, it threatens children everywhere," said Ian Riseley, chair of the Rotary Foundation and Past President of Rotary International. "Partnering with the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation helps us ensure that children in polio-affected countries get the lifesaving vaccines they need to be protected from polio for life."

This pledge comes on the heels of [Rotary's announcement at the Global Citizen Festival](#) pledging an additional US\$150 million towards polio eradication.
