**PP Ken Hill** introduced a new Altadena resident from Washington DC who is now a Rotary Club of Altadena member, Lisa Rickard, former Executive VP of the US Chamber of Commerce and President of the US Institute of Legal Reform.

**Jeannine Bogaard** introduced Ellen Kramer, Executive Director of Young & Healthy.

**PP Ken Joe** welcomed **Tammy Duke** to her first meeting as Corporate Alternate of Corporate Member Earnest Trust Management.

**President Justene** announced the voting results of the new board members for 2023-2023: **Don Andrues, Debi Kroman, George Farlardeau** and **Frank Fish**. George and Frank have served on previous boards.

**Tammy Silver** introduced today's speaker, Politics Professor Peter Dreier of Occidental College. Tammy reviewed not only his childhood connections to baseball and Jackie Robinson, but also his extensive credentials in journalism, city management, and city government.



PLAY BALL!!!! (If you are White.) While this was not the stated title of Peter's talk, it accurately describes it. Peter discussed Robinson's early life, his athletic accomplishments at Muir High School, at Pasadena Junior College, and UCLA. Peter's knowledge of Robinson is nothing short of encyclopedic, as he talked about Robinson's military service, his time in the Negro Baseball League, and key events during his rise to fame in the Major League. He spoke in detail of the many people, including the "good guys and the bad guys" (those terms are the words of this reporter) including the Black players, the White players, the owners, the managers, and the columnists involved in the segregation and desegregation movements in professional baseball. The role of the press was a key aspect of Peter's talk. Peter made very clear that every Black athlete owes a debt of gratitude to Jackie Robinson, who fought

racial injustice his entire career, and who may be Pasadena's most famous person.






## Riding in Style District Conference 2023 Horseshoe Las Vegas May 5-May7


