Dr. Dean Thompson

Mentoring and Being Mentored: What I Learned and Taught at Sing Sing Prison

Introducer: Helen Baatz



"In the spring of 2019, forty master degree inmates at the Sing Sing maximum security correction facility in Ossining, New York, were studying my book, *Mentoring: Biblical, Theological, and Practical Perspectives.* They asked me to meet with their class and lead a one-half day seminar on mentoring. My time with the inmates was among the most inspiring experiences of my life journey."

Dean K. Thompson is President and Professor of Ministry Emeritus, Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary. He received a Ph.D. in Church History from Union Presbyterian Seminary, Richmond Virginia., 1974. He received the D.D. from Centre College, 2005, and from Hanover College, 2007. He served as pastor in congregations in NC, NY, WV, TX and CA for more than thirty Years.

During his years of pastoral ministry, Thompson served as an adjunct professor at San Francisco Theological

Seminary and Union Presbyterian Seminary; and as a visiting lecturer at Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary. His major vocational commitments have included justice and mercy activities such as civil rights and racial issues, and anti-war and anti-death penalty concerns. The state of West Virginia presented Thompson its Martin Luther King Jr. Award for civil rights leadership in 2004.

Thompson's published volumes include Go Therefore: 150 Years of Presbyterians in Global Mission; Virginia Presbyterians in American Life; Essays on the History of the Household of Faith; and Mentoring: Biblical, Theological, and Practical Perspectives, which is used widely in

seminars, classrooms, and congregations.

Thompson's book in progress is *Profiles in Prophetic Leadership*. Grounded in lectures given at the Chautauqua Institute, the work will examine the lives of five incontestably great 20th century visionaries: Mohandas K. Gandhi, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, Pearl Buck, Reinhold Niebuhr and Martin Luther King Jr.

A PHF primer:



Paul Harris (pictured left) is the founder of Rotary International. He invited the first few members in Chicago in 1905. (They called it Rotary because meetings rotated between their offices.) At the 1917 convention, Arch Klumpf announced the establishment of an endowment "for the purpose of doing good in the world." The programs the Foundation supports range from Ambassadorial Scholarships, Matching Grants, PolioPlus and Rotary Peace Fellowships. The Foundation provides a portion of the funds for Pasadena's Global Grant project – Caring Little Hearts, which provides life-saving surgeries. Paul Harris Fellow recognition is awarded to those who donate \$1000 to the Foundation or have \$1000 donated in their name. Every additional \$1000 gets an additional award. We have 60 of those awards to hand out.

The Club also has a bank of Paul Harris Fellow points, which accrue whenever the Club makes contributions not attributed to an individual. This year, we used some of those points to get members who are close to that \$1000 donation mark over the finish line. We can also use those points to award a Paul Harris Fellow as an honor to someone. On the horizon:

Establishment of the Community Recipient of the Paul Harris Fellow award. Pasadena Rotary will honor a non-Rotarian who has made substantial contributions to the Pasadena Community. Pasadena Rotary will have a goal of being a**100% Foundation Giving Club**. This honor is given to clubs that achieve an average of \$100 in per capita giving and 100 percent participation, with every dues-paying member contributing at least \$25 to any or all of the following during the Rotary year: Annual Fund, PolioPlus Fund, approved global grants, or Endowment Fund. Many smaller clubs achieve this status. I am confident that Pasadena Rotary can achieve this goal.

Between the Paul Harris Fellow awards and the election of at-large members of the Nomination Committee , there's a lot of Club business on Wednesday. We'll be starting the meeting 15 minutes early so we don't take away from the speaker's time.



Past President Phil Miles (2017-2018) called the meeting to order at noon and turned things over to **Eric Olson**, who led us in a rousing chorus of You're a Grand Old Flag, accompanied by Music Committee Co-Chair **Don Andrues** on guitar. **Past President Mary Lou Byrne** gave the inspiration on the topic of leadership, including this from novelist Antoine de Saint-Exupéry: "If you want to build a ship, don't drum up the men to gather wood, divide the work, and give orders. Instead, teach them to yearn for the vast and endless sea."



After **Phil** explained that he was presiding over the meeting as part of our "Past Presidents Palooza" due to the loss of our president-elect right before the start of the Rotary year, he proceeded with announcements.

First, **Phil** himself told everyone to save the date for our Rotary District Conference, May 5-6 in lively Las Vegas. Details below.

Elect Training Session), his trip with wife Shelley to the Rotary International Convention in Atlanta, and the various good works done by the Club that year including Bikes for Christmas.

The clock was ticking but **PP Phil** remembered to get the guests introduced, most notably his wife Shelley Miles and Nancy Osborne, the wife of our speaker. **Howard Raff, Ericka Endrijones, Robert Earnest**, and **Jan Moscaret** also brought guests this week.



PP Phil introduced our speaker, Al Osborne, Emeritus Professor at UCLA's Anderson School of Management and codirector of its Corporate Governance Program. Al gave us a fascinating presentation about the importance of purpose, leadership, and culture in building enterprise. He talked about the various phases of growth of corporations, the crises these phases can cause, and the "humongous corporate failures" that can occur in the absence of adequate governance and oversight by boards of directors.

Bottom line: Directors have a duty of care and a duty of loyalty. If you can't do that (and/or if you're lazy), said AI, get off the board!

He also taught us some fun acronyms for board members: Remember to practice NIFO: "Noses in, fingers out." And, of

course, beware of GIGO (garbage in, garbage out), and the dreaded GAGA (going along (to) get along).


