Past President Mel Cohen rang the Rotary Bell today and relived his 2013 Rotary Year as Past President – "2013 was a good year, but NOT as GREAT as 1965" – the year that he married his wonderful German wife, Renate. She took her turn at the podium and recounted how her dad kept trying to stall this insistent American sax player from the US Army Band stationed down the road in Stuttgart from proposing to marry his daughter, and how they finally convinced dad that they were going to get married anyway – so he finally gave his blessing. And – ever the jokester, Mel remembers how his future father-in-law said, "You can't afford her" – and he was right about that!

Our song leader **Don Andrues** was inspired by our main speaker today, discussing retirement homes management, led us with a wistful Gordon Lightfoot tune, "Sundown"- probably meaning about Sundowners syndrome that besets older seniors with dementia, but the lyrics were about your girlfriend sneaking out after dark to date other men – maybe that's why they lock the doors at night in the Senior Living facilities?





PP MeI then introduced **Jim Osterling** for the Inspiration, and he inspired us with living examples of seniors who have accomplished great things later in life, like Julia Childs of Pasadena, who started writing cookbooks at age 50, or John Glenn who became the oldest person to fly in space at 87.

PP Mel asked us for a moment of silence on the passing of **Past President Joe Lonergan** (1990), who was the original organizer of our club's Teachers of Excellence – Joe was a great presence in the club for many years joining in 10/1/1960 - a **Pasadena Rotarian for 63 years**.

Mel Cohen brought his wonderful wife, Renate; Speaker **Jim Graunke** brought his wife, Judy; **PP Howard Raff** introduced potential member Claudia Ponce de Leon of Citizens Bank; Ken Hill brought potential member Bill Tilney, President of the Ambassador Foundation; **Cathy Simms** brought her husband Garrett Bell; and **Mary Chalon** brought her talented husband Lance Davis

PP Mel then took a few minutes to reflect on his years within the club and Pasadena – from his 1976 Group Rotary Exchange to Fiji with other business leaders from District 5300, which led

him to join Pasadena Rotary in 1976. He became President of the Pasadena Junior Chamber of Commerce (the JCs) in 1980, but felt the Rotary was a better fit with its more welcoming members and was active from then on, becoming President of the club in 2013.



Renate Cohen took the stage and recounted how Ken Hill (with red hair then) would be a frequent guest at their home, and the tent cards on our tables showed pictures of Ken with red hair, Susanne their daughter and a celebratory Renate and Mel opening Christmas presents, Mel playing sax in the Rose Bowl for UCLA, and a striking picture of Renate and Mel looking very fresh and beautiful. She recounted how Mel was put to the test to win Renate's hand, where a single rose in his hand and pleading outside her door finally won her over, and they were married six months later in a German Monastery, and how his Orthodox Rabbi wouldn't sign off on the certificate. Fifty years later, love still wins!

Then Mel told his joke about the three Samurai warriors who walked into a bar, a Chinese one, Japanese one, and Hiroshi Cohen...

Tammy Silver had to follow that act, and she did a good job introducing our speaker,**PP Jim Graunke** (2001-2002), who spent his entire professional career of 43 years in senior living communities' administration, both in Altadena and across the country. But first, inspired by Mel and Renate's love story, he recounted his courtship of Miss Judy, through chance encounters at Pasadena's Pie and Burger, to tennis and cycling trips throughout Europe as a fun-loving married couple, and on several charitable organizations across the country. And he had to remind us how good of a baker she is, supporting Parsons Nose Repertory Theater with free cookies to support the show!



Jim reflected on his 43 years, and how the Long-Term Care and Senior Living Centers get such a bad media rap when things go wrong, but that they serve a seriously useful place in our society, and people thrive and grow, even in their later years. Although 90% of people, when asked, would prefer to stay in their own homes until the end, the need is there for a senior community that supports active seniors.

He did a roll call of Pasadena Rotary members who are currently in local senior active facilities: Don Fedde, Kathy and Jim Meagher, Bill and Claire Bogaard, and soon Jeff and Joan Palmer - that he sees smart, pro-active seniors who have changed his life, and the lives of others around him through their life work. People like Dr. Dean Thompson, who started a mentoring program for incarcerated people in Sing Sing prison.

He told stories of several residents, who through their years where quite accomplished and creative, and even though they lived in a senior center, they showed spark and initiative to bring joy and life to all those around them. He felt the senior world is not depressing, even though people do live their last days there, they have so much to share and live, and he shared several stories of remarkable pioneers in our society who invented the laser, made history by defending freedom of the press, and changing healthcare.

PP MeI brought the meeting to a close with one of his signature jokes, (not a blonde joke, those were outlawed after his administration), so "a red-headed gal arrives at a castaway's island on a surfboard..."


