Dean Billman, District 5300 Polio Chair, with co-chairs **Morgan Nadeau** and **PP Mary Lou Byrne**, reminded everyone that Thursday, October 24th at 7am is the World Polio Day Walk Around the Rose Bowl, raising money to eradicate polio through efforts to beat back the rise of cases worldwide. Asking for a show of hands of those who have already given \$100 this year towards Polio Plus, a sea of hands went up – they all earned a red Polio Plus wristband!

PP Justene Adamec announced the Impact Club's Ronald McDonald House bin for Halloween costumes and candy will be available until next week – see above.

Dede Venkat, representing www.Laist.com/vote and the City of Pasadena, pointed out flyers on everyone's tables to help understand the upcoming ballots going to people's homes now. She apologized for being the first person to violate President Stephen's table flyer ban, but it was for a good cause.

PP Rob Fisher asked if the new rules included extra minutes on the announcement docket for Past Presidents, and President Stephen took a few seconds to consider before allowing one more violation of his new rules – it is tough being a new President to this rowdy club. PP Rob then proceeded to promote a most wonderful and unique venture in two weeks – the accent up mountain roads to have dinner at Mt. Wilson and peak through the famous telescope at night. At

our table, **Dr. Paul Martin**, in his new 2024 mid-engine Corvette Stingray, was excited that he could race to the top before anyone else. **PP Rob** wasn't finished – he teased us with a Save the Date of our Holiday Party on December 4^{th} at Jacob Maarse – a hallowed tradition that we have fond memories of Holidays past.

Angie Pizano, co-chair of Rotary Roamers, announced that the Mt. Baldy hike was back on this Saturday, delayed by the wildfires in early September.

Board member David McAlexander asked, "who wants to run away and join the circus?" – our next Done in a Day will be to help Don Benito Fundamental School Carnival on November 19th – to do whatever they need. No elephants.

PP Cory Brendel, wearing a white smock with Huntington Hospital logo, has been fully trained as a volunteer at the Hospital, serenading the patients with his therapeutic ukelele as their newest "Music Ambassador." President Stephen then announced the premier of Herb Alpert's documentary may have found an appropriate venue – the Rialto Theater in South Pasadena. South Pasadena Rotary President Dave Morales is working with us for a date.

Finally, **President Stephen** noted that Rotary International is coordinating a response to help victims of both Hurricane Helene, and now Hurricane Milton. And then he announced a new meeting for chairs and committee leaders for an overview of staffing and leadership goals.



It was time to hear from our **District Governor**, **Mike Driebe**, and he started with asking how many of us have participated in a cultural exchange trip - his was to India, where it changed his life.

DG Mike then awarded our club with two awards: the first was fundraising success of our Rotary International Polio Plus contributions; and the second was our club's 100% participation to Rotary International Foundation, a feat uncommon among all clubs – 4,600 out of 46,000 clubs worldwide.

The first thing he asked was for President Stephen to turn to his camera and speak for a few moments on "What is Rotary?" and President Stephen, impromptu, said he was proud of being our

President and of the service projects the club offered our community.

DG Mike spoke of his service projects over the years – the impact of delivering new wheelchairs to paralyzed children in a small Mexican village outside of Puerto Vallerta, and the ongoing commitment as a member of Rotary for over 30 years. A lifetime in Professional non-profit fundraising, he relates to serving with a focus on commitment to the community, and "The Joys of Service and the Joys of Fellowship."

It is the duty of every DG to spur us on every year to service, community, and growing membership; but the urgency to be relevant in today's world, especially with all the Baby Boomer men retiring, was his main concern – he exclaimed that Rotary would be extinct by 2070. While noting that our club was over 104 years old, he urged us to get more involved in the community, more involved with service, and more fellowship opportunities.

Marketing is big, and he encouraged us to promote www.comeseewhatwedo.org to anyone looking for opportunities for community service, and the site will direct them to local Rotary clubs, and their local calendars, service projects and volunteer opportunities. He then encouraged us to update our club sites for these new visitors, with one or two paragraphs of our club and our meeting times. He commended us on our Impact Club for busy young professionals. We also got high marks for our participation in Ending Polio Now efforts, and our youth leadership opportunities as we supported the District music and speech contests, and the weekend Rotary Youth Leadership camp (RYLA). He commended **Hassan Kheradmandan** and our District Peace Conference and encouraged us all to attend the next one in January 2025.

He ended with his call to attend the District Conference at the most magical place on Earth -

Disneyland on April 11-12, and the Rotary International Convention in Calgary, Alberta, Canada (a growing list of Pasadena Rotarians are planning to attend – see **PE Hillary Schenk**). He left us with the power of his lesson when he attended his cultural exchange in India – with the Indian cultural idea that all guests are welcomed as sacred – "God is embodied as your guest."

President Stephen called the meeting at 1:30pm.


