Simply Stephen Smith's Spokes Speaks



World Polio Day is October 24th. The good news and the bad news. The good news is that polio continues to be beaten back to an ever smaller number of countries. The bad news is that as long as it exists anywhere, it's a threat everywhere. Exactly how does Rotary and its partners in the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI) prioritize where to direct their resources?

Remaining high on the list are two remaining endemic countries, Afghanistan and Pakistan. Since 1988, the GPEI has reduced caes of wild poliovirus around the world by 99.9%. Outside of these two endemic countries, the GPEI has identified four (4) "most consequential geographies" - places where poliovirus variants continue to circulate.

These areas are Northern Nigeria, the Eastern Democratic Republic of Congo, Northern Yemen, and South-central Somalia. By prioritizing resources to these four geographies, the GPEI hopes to turn off the tap to prevent further spread.

On a similar note, WHO chief Tedros Ghebreyesus tweeted that it had been "a massive success amidst a tragic daily reality of life" for more than two million Gazans who have been caught up in the intense fighting since last October's terrorist attacks from Hamas unleashed the war in Gaza. In three phases over twelve days, from September 1 to September 12, UN agencies and partners provided oral polio vaccine type 2 to some 558,963 children, reaching families living in shelters, tents and camps for the displaced. Swift action by the GPEI, from the moment the virus was detected to the launch of the campaign - speaks to the effectiveness of the polio programme.



On Dementia: "Where memory fades, but Love remains," was our inspiration from **Kelly White** today, and our speaker gave a presentation how we might be able to help those family members with dementia be able to afford living in a care facility without selling the family home, through creative finance.

President Stephen Smith rang the mighty brass bell at 12:30pm, and asked **Don Andrues**, accompanied by our terrific piano musician Ann Louise Christensen, to begin our song, and Don observed that since the topic today was about finances, maybe we could sing the standard, "Pennies from Heaven", but the words changed to "Funding from Heaven", much to the delight of the singers.

Kelly White recited a poem about dementia, and the one phrase that stood out was, "the Mind Forgets, but the Heart Remains." **Agnes Bollinger**, friend of **John McDannel**, mentioned that this was a welcome reflection on giving all of us patience when we are frustrated with family forgetfulness.

- **David** and co-chair **Alex Oscco** also reminded us of the upcoming Thanksgiving dinner service that we as a club will participate in November, and a truly giving experience to serve beyond self and feel good doing it. You can be the perfect Rotarian. More info coming.
- **President Stephen** reminded us of the upcoming Mt. Wilson very special extracurricular event this Friday the box dinner and telescope facility onsite visit to Mt. Wilson Observatory. He is offering to carpool up to three extra people if you want to meet in the U-Club parking lot at 4pm. Dinner is at 5pm and viewing soon after dark. I am going are you? Note: the last time the club did this event was the summer of 2009, and we think we saved Mt. Wilson from the Station Fire because we cleared brush from around the buildings. We did that.

President Stephen introduced our speaker, **Preston Howard** of Rose City Realty, Inc. in Pasadena. While Preston started out by saying his firm

offers funding for housing projects and industrial programs, they also specialize in helping anyone who can't get a traditional loan at a big bank because of several situations: problem balance sheets, short timeline to receive needed funds, and the worst problem sometimes, squabbling siblings.

Preston discussed several scenarios, and he held the room in rapt attention because these were local stories. One family near Lake and Colorado owned an expensive block of commercial real estate and were ill-advised to move the property from family-held, to another legal holding that would allow tax-managed estate advantage. The problem was, the current lender was not included in the planning and sued the family, and they demanded immediate repayment of the loan, causing a cash crunch.





Preston's firm finally offered a short-term solution, and immediate cash to pay the lender and keep the real estate in the family name. The interest might have been higher than a big or local bank would normally offer, but the fact that the property was held up in court and the lender was going to win the suit prompted the family to agree to terms and settle the bill.

Preston then told his story of his loving family and mother - they had to deal with dementia within their own family. A huge crisis of a quickly declining family member, the beloved mother, necessitated finding a dementia facility which Preston was able to fund it without selling the home through a third-party private lending team. They had to pay a higher interest rate, but the funds were quickly raised, and the house was saved for his family's next generation to live in. All while not raising the 50-year-old property tax base.

This seems to be the solution for many seniors who have family members who wish to care for mom or dad, but do not have ready

cash immediately. Several Pasadena Rotarians in the legal field help with conservatorships as fiduciaries for the family in need, thereby bypassing the inevitable fight for control for the family money before mom passes away. Preston thanked several club members, including **Robert Earnest**, **Bob Risley**, **Suzanne Cohen**, **Jan Copley**, **and Eric Olson**.

It was a great meeting, with the weaving of different Rotarians of several practices, all coming together to help local citizens in need with their combined knowledge, wisdom, and resources. The crowd around Preston after the meeting shows there is a need for his kind of services and knowledge, and he would make a great addition to our club. Send him an application!

President Stephen awarded Preston with a Magic Mug and called the meeting at 1:30pm.


