The Rebirth of Old Pasadena: The Untold Story

Former City of Pasadena Development Administrator, Marsha Rood, is the recipient of;

In addition, the Pasadena Museum of History, the California State Senate and the State Assembly named her a Living History Maker in 2003. Marsha is a Fellow of the American Institute of Certified Planners; only 614 out

of 44,000 planners in the United States have that distinction. She holds a BA degree from Stanford University, a Masters in Planning degree with honors from USC's School of Planning, and completed course work for her PhD in Urban Studies at USC. Rood is a graduate of the National Trust for Historic Preservation's Certified Main Street Manager and is a graduate of Leadership Pasadena.

As part of her community work, Marsha is co-founder of the Downtown Pasadena Neighborhood Association, the Pasadena Coalition for a Common Vision, Pasadenans for a Livable City, and the Pasadena Civic Center Coalition. Marsha serves as a Trustee and Property Committee Chair of the Pasadena Presbyterian Church. Marsha recently has been appointed to Pasadena Senior Center Board of Directors. She is also a member of the Women's Committee of the

Pasadena Symphony Association, The Shakespeare Club, and Pasadena Rotary Club.

## Simply Stephen Smith's Spokes Speaks

#### Proposal to change our lunches from Wednesday to Monday

At our lunch meeting on Wednesday I relayed a proposal to our members from Robert Hartstein, General Manager/CEO of the University Club of Pasadena. Mr. Hartstein's proposal was to see if the Pasadena Rotary Club would be interested in moving our lunches from our traditional Wednesday to Monday. If the Board ultimately passes this proposal, it would not become effective until 07/01/25. This would coincide with PE Hillary Schenk becoming the President of Pasadena Rotary. I had conversed with three (3) prior PP's and all unanimously agreed that bringing this proposal to the "regularly attending lunch members" would be the proper thing to do.

A financial incentive to move to this new day is the all-inclusive lunch would drop to \$30 per person, without compromising the quality and service we have come to expect. As in most things, there are positive and negative ramifications that one must consider. The lower price might be attractive to some members, and the lower price might also potentially bring in more members. The downside from this is that many people who travel typically like to wrap a Friday and Monday into the trip, thus potentially lowering attendance. Additionally, many holidays are on a Monday, thereby decreasing the number of lunches throughout a fiscal year. We took a vote on the matter last Wednesday and will take three additional votes on Wednesday lunches so as to include those folks who were away on a trip, or sick, etc.

The Board meets on the 3rd Thursday of every month, and therefore will meet again on 11/21. To be clear, it is the Board that ultimately makes the final decision on this matter. Bringing feedback from the "regularly attending lunch members" should allow the Board to make an informed decision.




