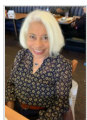

Lois Derry passed away a few days ago. She had been a Rotarian for 35 years, joining the San Marino Club in 1989. She and her husband, Bill, lived on Old Mill Road. She was a Paul Harris Fellow. She lived into her 90s. Lois began her real estate career as an escrow officer, transitioning to residential sales with Prudential California, and then to Coldwell Banker Residential. She had a most-beneficial pipeline with Cal Tech, becoming aware of incoming professors and administrators to sell them homes in the area.

In the Rotary club, she was particularly fond of the RYLA program and had served as a facilitator. Always a lady of style and grace, she will long be remembered for her fabulous Christmas parties and for her long dedication of service to the Crowell Public Library.

Chris Datwyler, at 83, died three weeks ago. He had been a Rotarian for 39 years, and he and Sally are Paul Harris Fellows. They lived on Wallingford Road.

His computer skills and service to the Club and District were sorely missed. He was made an Honorary Member on February 24, 2018.
