"Ronald McDonald House Charities Dayton Capital Campaign and Construction Cha Cha"



RMHC Dayton recently celebrated 43 years of providing Community Comfort and Hope to families with critically ill and injured children and they are once again growing to **Keep MORE Families Close.**

With the recent growth in pediatric healthcare specialties in our region, RMHC Dayton has seen a significant increase in demand for services. Last year the Ronald McDonald House turned away approximately 77% of the families who requested a stay in one of our 14 guest rooms. Additionally, the current guest rooms are not large enough to meet the needs of today's families, the common spaces do not adequately support families, the current building is aging with ongoing maintenance needs, and the facility is no longer ADA compliant.

The Ronald McDonald House Expansion project includes constructing a new 38,000 sq ft building that upon completion, will accommodate 42 families.

Galvan spoke to a packed house at the convention about their club's innovative programs.

Past President Carlo Capua spoke first for the Fort Worth delegation, complimenting our hybrid meeting setup and Kelly's ambassadorship on behalf of our club. Carlo gave some club history – theirs is one of the oldest and was the 2nd largest club in the world in 1993. Their membership has steadily declined in recent years, so Carlo looked for new ways to be relevant and increase membership. They began by hosting Courageous Conversations to tackle difficult and controversial issues while raising community awareness of the club. Issues included Student Leaders, African-American History, Police versus Community, and Religion. The most impactful conversation was about supporting underserved businesses, an idea brought up by Chris Jordan. The Rotary Club of Fort Worth didn't have a membership representative of the larger local business community, which became evident through this conversation. It led the club to launch the Rotary Minority Business Award, which recognizes minority-owned businesses in the community and offers a free six-month club membership. The RMBA totally transformed their club by making them more recognized in the community, growing and diversifying membership, and bringing new excitement to the club.

Chris Jordan shared his thoughts about creating and planning the RMBA program and its impact on the Club's culture and engagement. A past recipient of the RMBA, Adrian Galvan, spoke about what it meant to win the award and its impact on his business. Due to his experience with the RMBA, he officially joined the Rotary Club of Fort Worth. Past President Courtney Lewis, who succeeded Chris, spoke next about the importance of continuity in ensuring the success of the program. As the first African-American president of the Club, Courtney shared her insights into the impact RMBA had on club diversity. Following its launch, the Board diversified faster than the club at large, showing a willingness to change that led to today's diverse club membership. Today, the club has grown with a more vibrant and inclusive membership.

After questions and answers, Walt Hibner thanked the Fort Worth delegation for their insightful presentation. The Outstanding Foundation promotional video was shown without any technical difficulties. Walt complimented the video and sought a volunteer to pull the Queen of Hearts ticket. Frank Scott won the drawing but selected the ten of spades. Walt reiterated there will be no meeting next week. Rita Cyr will present an exciting project at the Ronald McDonald house at the next meeting. Walt then adjourned the meeting.
